SYLLABUS

Course Description

Introduction to business concepts, accounting terms, and financial reporting. Students will learn how to apply accounting tools and techniques to make sound financial decisions for nonprofit/for-profit organizations and individual health science practices.

Learning Objectives

The goals and objectives of the course are as follows:

- Introduction to business and financial reporting
 - o Distinguish between the forms of business
 - Define financial terms related to accounting
 - o Identify and explain financial statements
- Application of financial ratios to analyze financial information
 - Use financial ratios to measure the performance of an organization
- Review of budget process and cash management principles
 - Develop budgets and apply cash management tools
- Introduction to internal control principles
 - Use internal control principles to identify and repair internal control weaknesses
- Introduction to planning for investments in capital projects
 - o Analyze and compare financial information for investments
 - o Appy investment techniques to identify appropriate capital projects
