The course syllabus is a general plan for the course; deviations announced to the class by the instructor may be necessary.

### **Course Overview**

This course covers topics in corporate finance such as capital budgeting, cost of capital, leasing and real options, theories and applications of capital structure, corporate control, and corporate governance. An emphasis will be placed on understanding the ideas behind capital budgeting and the cost of capital. Prereq: 3220 (620), AcctMIS 2200, 2300, BusMgt 2320 (330), 2321 (331), and BusMHR 2291 or 2292 (BusAdm 499.01) Not open to students with credit for 721, 4210 or 4212.

## **Text (Recommended)**

Berk, DeMarzo, and Harford, *Fundamentals of Corporate Finance*, 4<sup>th</sup> edition, Pearson. You are welcome to use earlier or later editions of the book.

## **Financial Calculator (Recommended)**

HP-10bII+, TI BAII Plus (this is what I have), or others.
