Course Description:

An introduction to Commercial property and Casualty Insurance. General topics of study will include Fundamentals of risk, a review of the risk management process, insurance contract analysis, and insurance company operations. The course will cover other topics including basics of liability, legal principles, enterprise risk management for businesses, and an analysis of Commercial Property and Liability policy forms, conditions and exclusions.

Course Learning Outcomes:

Some of the learning objective and course outcomes include the following:

- Explain and understand the historical definition of risk.
- Explain and understand the meaning of loss exposure.
- Be able to differentiate the distinct types of risk including, pure, speculative, diversifiable, non-diversifiable and systemic.
- Understand and use the principle of indemnity in a hypothetical claim situation.
- Define and explain subrogation and the insurable interest.
- Know the legal requirements for a valid insurance contract.
- Be familiar with The financial operations and the various types of insurers
- Discuss the basis of legal liability and the elements of negligence.
- Understand the various legal doctrines including Res ipsa loquitar, and 'last clear chance' rule.
- Discuss tort liability claim examples and developing insurance issues.
- Understand what is covered under the Commercial Property and Casualty policy form.

- Become familiar with The Commercial Property and Liability policy forms, conditions and exclusions.
- Review various Professional Policy forms including Directors and Officers, Cyber Liability, and Fiduciary Liability, Commercial Umbrella policy and Employment Practices Liability.

How this course works:

This course is 100% synchronous and online. It is encouraged that you review slide presentations in the modules and use the textbook for further detail and clarifications on the concepts being presented. We will cover about one chapter each week, so it's important to stay up to date with the schedule.

Quizzes: The quizzes will be scheduled following each chapter or topic. The quizzes are designed to prepare you for the mid-term and final exams as well as to gauge understanding of the material. The quizzes will cover the major topics of the chapter presented in the PowerPoints.

The dates for the quizzes are dependent on the progress we are making in class, but I will try to stay on the schedule in the course calendar. There will be no make-up quizzes or exams unless you have a valid family or health emergency. Please email the instructor, prior to the exam, quiz, or assignment.

Discussion Questions: Some of these assignments will be taken from the cases in the textbook or the application questions at the end of the chapter.

Mid-Term and Final Exam: Exams are closed book and will be given about every four weeks.

Grading:

The total number of points you earn for the semester, divided by the total number of points possible (375), yields your <u>Total Percent Score</u>. - Request passcodes to keep as a backup authentication option. When you see the Duo login screen on your computer, click Enter a Passcode and then click the Text-menew-codes button; you'll get ten passcodes good for 365 days that can each be used once
