Course Description: The course introduces students to key concepts in financial management,

including securities, capital budgeting, working capital management, risk and return, cost of capital, capital structure, valuation, and mergers and acquisitions. The course also covers financial economics theory and empirical evidence on corporate financial policies and applications. The course is intended for students with aspirations for careers in finance.
