Course Description

This is a customized course for students in the SMB – Finance program to provide training in professional development skills. Topics include professional communications, networking, presentation skills, effective teamwork, and project management. The course also provides introductions to main career paths in finance to help students decide on their area of specialization. To enhance student learning, the course will also include company visits.

Course Prerequisites

Enrollment in the SMB – Finance program.

Grading Procedures

• **Course Grade:** The course grade will be based on a series of individual tasks and assignments, regular attendance of weekly meetings.

The final grade composition is as follows:

Individual assignments 60% Attendance & engagement 40%

As required by school policy, grading will be based on relative rather than absolute standards. The average grade in this course will be a 3.6 or lower.

Attendance and Class Participation

In this required SMF course, SMF students are expected to attend each weekly meeting. The course includes presentations, in-class activities, panel discussions with finance professionals, and company visits. The best way to learn is to be present, engage with the presenters and your classmates, and follow up to practice skills with the class assignments.

To ensure students attend class, we will be taking attendance at the beginning of each meeting. Students are also encouraged to engage through questions during the panel discussions on careers paths in finance and company visits. We will be marking class participation during those meetings.
