- Applicants' chances of admission are enhanced by taking MATH 1151-2 or 1161-2 (rather than 1131) and ECON 2001H and 2002H. Some students will be asked to do a short interview with the program director. Note only MATH 1131 or 1151 are required for Business majors.
- Students are encouraged to take additional Economics or Mathematics and to pursue minors or second majors in Economics or Statistics.
- Completion of at least 8 honors courses in Accounting and MIS, including ACCTMIS 2200H, 2300H, 3100H, 3200H, 3201H, 3300H and at least 2 from the following courses: 3400H, 3600H, 4XXXH*, 5200H, 5500H. For additional requirements to graduate with honors accounting, visit the Accounting Honors website.
- BUSMHR2292 is waived for students who <u>complete</u> the Accounting Honors program.
- BUSOBA 2321 is waived for students who complete ACCTMIS 3100H
- *An Accounting elective on Professional Research in Accounting is available for students who have completed 3201H. It will have a new code (4XXXH) to be available in Autumn or Spring for Seniors.
- The Accounting Honors program structure does not allow for winter internships, but the majority of Accounting Honors students complete summer internships in accounting, business, or government. Some students do an internship as early as summer of the sophomore year (25%); the majority of Accounting Honors students do internships in summer of the junior year (90%). - Accounting Honors Program students who enter the Combined BSBA/Master of Accounting Program
