Dear Christ Church,

Greetings in the Name of our Lord Jesus Christ whose Goodness and Mercy endure forever!

Please receive warm greetings from Rhoda, Shalom and Raphael. We descend on our knees every day to thank God for not only this partnership with you but also to pray for you. I am always encouraged when I hear from you and indeed, I was thrilled when Rev. Keith arranged a meeting with me.

We have been fairly well here in Uganda. We have a series of sicknesses especially with my wife Rhoda who had severe malaria and had to stay in hospital for some time. She is now much better by God's Grace.

This year God has opened for us wide doors for ministry. Beginning January 1st, ¹ was appointed chaplain at Mityana Secondary School. This is the biggest school in my diocese. It has about a thousand students and seventy members of staff. I do counselling and Bible studies to both students and teachers, conduct daily morning devotions with the students, and also do preaching on Sundays in the school community services.

Beginning this year, I teach at the Uganda Martyrs' Seminary. The seminary is located at Namugongo, a historical site where on 3rd June 1886 twenty-five young men were burnt to death on the orders of the king of Buganda because of their faith in the Lord Jesus Christ. A museum was erected in this place to tell this story. This term I am teaching the survey of the Old Testament to the Certificate in Theology class. I have twelve students in my class coming from various dioceses in Uganda. I should state that I feel so privileged to partake in teaching at seminary.

Beginning this month (February), I am to start studies at the South African Theological Seminary. I was meant to start this week but unfortunately, I couldn't because I have not cleared the required fees to enable me start. I hope to begin next week if all goes well. I hope I will not miss on deadlines.
