The month of November had various activities. I went to a number of workshops and held community meetings to especially pray and give encouragement to people affected by the Ebola disease pandemic. Two of our neighbouring districts are still under lockdown until 17th December if no extension will be decreed by the government.

I also participated in a week-long alumni conference at Uganda Martyrs' Seminary where we were reminded about faithful Biblical teaching. I have also had opportunities to preach the Gospel in various churches and media platforms.

I am so glad to inform you that Crosslinks, a Christian missionary organisation accepted to pay tuition for my studies starting at the beginning of next year. This has been my prayer request for a while. I am so thankful to God for this wonderful opportunity. However, I will have to cater for the other study costs besides tuition.

In other news, the Bishop of my Diocese has asked me to lead a parish effective 1st January, 2023. This parish is called Kiwesa and is made up of five Churches. I will serve as rector in this parish in addition to doing chaplaincy at Mityana Secondary School, teaching at the Seminary and doing studies.
