The *future* must be the grand object of the eyes of our faith!

Our sins cast out,
These bodies of death and decay destroyed,
Our souls made perfect;
hailed as more than conquerors,
crowned by the hand of Christ,
embraced in the arms of Jesus,
glorified with Him,
And made to sit together with Him on His throne!

All these, brothers and sisters, are reserved in heaven for you, who are kept by the power of God through faith for salvation ready to be revealed in the last time.
