TONIGHT'S GAME

The Texas Stars (18-8-2-1) are back on home ice tonight for the first time in the new year to play host to the Rockford IceHogs (12-13-3-1) at the H-E-B Center at Cedar Park.

Texas is coming off a three-game road trip that featured a two-game sweep against the Manitoba Moose on Dec. 29 and 31, where they won 6-2 on Friday before prevailing 3-2 on Sunday afternoon. Then on Tuesday, the Stars fell 3-2 to the Chicago Wolves at Allstate Arena in Rosemont, Illinois.

Rockford is 3-5-1-1 in its last 10 games, which includes splitting a series against the Milwaukee Admirals last time out. The IceHogs split the home-and-home series by falling 5-4 in a shootout on Saturday before winning 4-3 on home ice on New Year's Eve.

The Stars upended the IceHogs 5-1 in Rockford during the first meeting of the season back on Nov. 8.

LAST TIME ON THE ICE..


The Texas Stars had their winning streak snapped at four games with a 3-2 loss to the Chicago Wolves on Tuesday at Allstate Arena.

Nick Caamano opened the scoring in the first period by beating Keith Kinkaid with a far side shot off a rush to put the Stars on top 1-0 at 6:20. Texas carried the one-goal advantage into the first intermission despite being outshot 14-4 by Chicago in the opening 20 minutes.

In the second period, Max Comtois shoveled a pass from Chris Terry past Remi Poirier at 1:12 to tie the game 1-1. The Stars reclaimed a 2-1 lead at 12:14 when Matthew Seminoff chipped a rebound past Kinkaid. The Wolves then tied the game just over a minute later when Matt Donovan also buried a rebound at 13:39.

The third period saw Rocco Grimaldi score off a pass from Josh Melnick to give Chicago its first lead and eventual game-winner with 8:33 left on the člock. Chicago held on until the end of regulation for a 3-2 victory, ending the Stars' winning streak at four games.

Kinkaid earned the win in goal for the Wolves to improve to 4-8-1 on the campaign after making 24 saves on 26 shots. Poirier came down with the loss to fall to 10-4-2 on the season after making saves on 32 of the 35 shots he faced.



PLAYER SPOTLIGHT

Remi Poirier has held it down between the pipes for the Stars during the absence of his counterpart, Matt Murray, who was called up to Dallas for an emergency stint in place of Jake Oettinger. As a result, the Farnham, Quebec, native has made six straight starts and is 4-2-0 in doing so with a 2.87 goals-against average and .915 save percentage. Overall this season, Poirier sports a 10-4-2 mark with a 3.04 GAA and .910 SV%. He was drafted by Dallas in the sixth round, 185th overall of the 2020 National Hockey League Draft.

NEWS & NOTES

A LONE STAR STAPLE

On Dec. 30, the American Hockey League announced Texas Stars Head Coach Neil Graham will lead the Central Division's All-Stars at the 2024 AHL All-Star Classic, which will be held Feb. 4-5 in San Jose, California. Graham earned the honor for a second season in a row by virtue of the Stars clinching the lead in the Central Division by the pre-determined Dec. 31 deadline.

Standing at fourth in the entire American Hockey League this season in terms of winning percentage (.672), the Stars have a tight grasp on the top spot in the American Hockey League's Central Division with 39 points backed by a 18-8-2_1 record. Standing in second and chasing the Stars are the Milwaukee Admirals, who hold 35 points so far in 28 games played with a 17-10-1-0 mark. With that in mind, Texas leads this season's series between the division rivals with a 2-0-1-0 mark so far and five games left unplayed on the schedule.

The Texas Stars are competing to repeat as Central Division Champions after totalling 92 points with a 40-20-9-3 record last season to fight off the Admirals, who finished with 89 points in the standings. However, the Admirals eventually got last laugh, besting the Stars three games to two in the 2023 Central Div. Finals. Texas has won its division three times, including 2012-13 (South) and 2013-14 (West).

TEXAS-SIZED OFFENSE

The Texas Stars lead the American Hockey League with 116 goals scored this season. Last Friday's 6-2 win over the Manitoba Moose in Winnipeg marked the Stars 17th time in 29 games scoring four or more goals in a game this season. When Texas does so, it is 14-1-2-0 overall and 7-1-0-0 in road contests.

While the Stars found themselves scoring in bulk around the holidays, Mavrik Bourque and Fredrik Karlstrom were heavily involved and recorded hat tricks 10 days apart. Bourque accomplished the feat first by scoring all four of the Stars' goals in a 4-3 overtime win on home ice against Grand Rapids on Dec. 19. Then on Friday night (Dec. 29) in Manitoba, Karlstrom recorded his first career AHL hat trick as well as the Stars second of the season by tucking three goals on the way to a 6-2 victory. In terms of league goal-scoring statistical leaders this season, Bourque (13) and Karlstrom (13) check in at a tie for eighth in the AHL behind Logan Stankoven, who stands at fifth with 15 goals scored this season.

THE DYNAMIC DUO

Despite being held off the scoresheet last time out at Chicago, Stars forwards Mavrik Bourque and Logan Stankoven remained tied for the top spot in the American Hockey League when it comes to point production. Bourque (13-25=38) and Stankoven (15-23=38) each have 38 points and stank six points clear of any other players at the top of the league.

Bourque, 21, is among the top of the AHL in several major stat categories, including points (38, T-1st), assists (25, T-3rd), goals (15, 5th) and power-play assists (11, T-4th). The right-handed forward was named the AHL's Player of the Week for the period ending Dec. 24 after he scored five goals on five shots in two games, which included the four-goal game vs. Grand Rapids on Dec. 19. Additionally, Bourque was named the AHL Player of the Month for November after putting up 17 points (4-13=17) in 10 games.

Stankoven, 20, is the top rookie in the AHL so far this season. The Kamloops, British Columbia, native leads AHL first-years in goals (15), points (38), power-play assists (12), first goals (5) and points per game (1.31). The right-handed forward was named the AHL's Rookie of the Month for November after posting eight goals and seven assists for 15 points in 10 games throughout the month.

DON'T SLEEP ON THE STARS

The Texas Stars completed another come-from-behind victory, 3-2, on the road against the Manitoba Moose on Sunday night. It marked the Stars' fifth time in 29 games this season picking up at least one point in a contest after trailing during the third period. Out of those five third-period comeback victories for Texas, three of them have occurred in enemy territory. With that in mind, the Stars are 5-3-2-1 in one-goal games this season. Sunday's affair saw Texas score twice inside the final two minutes of regulation, with Logan Stankoven (18:18) evening the score before Alex Petrovic (18:55) put the Stars on top.

Texas is arguably the most-disciplined squad in the AHL with the lowest mark for penalty minutes at 275. On top of that, the Stars lead the league with 116 goals scored this season thanks in large part to Texas owning the AHL's second-best power play at 24.8% (27-for-109). When the Stars score a goal with the man advantage this season, they are 12-4-1-1, which includes a 7-1-1-1 mark in games at home. When Texas scores the first goal in game's this year, they are 13-3-1-1 and 3-0-1-1 at home.

2023-24 COACHING STAFF



NEIL GRAHAM - Head Coach (5th Season)



Neil Graham was promoted to head coach of the Texas Stars on December 10, 2019 to fill the vacancy left by Derek Laxdal who was promoted to assistant coach of the Dallas Stars the same day. The following night he earned his first win as the head coach of the Stars, a 3-1 victory over Manitoba. He went on to finish the shortened season with an 18-15-2-2 record at the helm. Graham was previously hired as assistant coach of the Stars on July 8, 2019, joining the team for his first stint of coaching at the American Hockey League level. Graham, 38, led the Stars to their first Calder Cup playoff appearance since 2018 in 2021-22, ending with a first round loss to Rockford. He guided Texas to the top of the Central Division in 2022-23, as the Stars won their first division title since 2014. The Stars swept Rockford in the 2023 division semifinals before coming up just short against Milwaukee in the division finals.

Before making the move to Cedar Park, Texas, he served as head coach of the Idaho Steelheads, the ECHL affiliate of the Dallas Stars, from 2015 to 2019. Over that span, he amassed a 166-91-31 record in 288 regular-season contests and led Idaho to three consecutive 40-win seasons and guided the Steelheads to the Kelly Cup Playoffs in all four of his campaigns at the helm. The Calgary, Alberta native is a graduate of Mercyhurst University where he played four seasons before turning pro. Graham recorded 60 points (23-37=60) and 128 penalty minutes over 137 NCAA games. He turned pro in 2010 and split three seasons between the ECHL and Southern Professional Hockey League, accruing 98 points (42-56=98) in 113 professional games.

TRAVIS MORIN - Assistant Coach (5th Season)



Travis Morin was promoted to assistant coach of the Texas Stars on December 10, 2019. During the shortened 2019-2020 season, Morin stepped in for Head Coach Neil Graham for a pair of games and recorded a win in his debut commanding the bench, a 5-4 victory against Colorado on March 10, 2020.

Morin, 39, ended his playing career with the Texas Stars following the 2018-19 season after 10 years with the organization and 12 professional seasons overall. Morin retired as the Stars franchise leader in points (560), goals (175), assists (385), and games played (686). On Oct. 19, 2019, he became the first player in team history to have his jersey number (#23) retired. His 686 games played with the Stars are the most by any AHL player with one organization since 1974. The Brooklyn Park, Minnesota native captained the team during the 2015-16 and 2016-17 seasons, was a four-time AHL All-Star, and led the Stars in scoring across five of his 10 seasons. He was a focal point of Texas' 2014 Calder Cup Championship season, capturing the Les Cunningham Award (AHL MVP), John B. Sollenberger Award (Regular Season Scoring Leader), and Jack A. Butterfield Award (Calder Cup Playoff MVP) that season. Morin is also the organization's most decorated postseason scorer, earning 64 points (23-42=64) in 87 playoff games.

Morin is a graduate of Minnesota State University-Mankato where he played all four years before turning pro in 2007. Across 151 games at his alma mater, Morin recorded 133 points (58-75=133) and served as team captain in his senior season of 2006-07. Before joining the Stars, he also played for the South Carolina Stingrays in the ECHL and Hershev Bears from 2007 to 2009.

MAX FORTUNUS - Assistant Coach (3rd Season)



Max Fortunus was hired as assistant coach of the Texas Stars on May 20, 2021. It is his first coaching position following a 17-year professional career that spanned more than 1,100 regular season games in the NHL, AHL, DEL, and ECHL. Six of those seasons were spent with the Stars including a three-year stint as team captain. Fortunus, 40, moved behind the bench after spending the previous three seasons with Fischtown of the Deutsche Eishockey Liga (DEL), Germany's top professional hockey league. He recorded 50 points (7-43=50) in 139 career DEL games with Fischtown, serving as an assistant captain for all three seasons with the club from 2018-21.

Fortunus spent 15 seasons in the AHL where he amassed 286 points (76-210=286) in 882 career games with Houston, Manitoba, Texas, Iowa and Springfield. The former defenseman recorded 167 points (44-123=167) in 402 career games with Texas over six seasons from 2009-15. Fortunus was named Texas' captain from 2012-15. He ranks third in Texas Stars history in games played (402), fourth in assists (123), sixth in points (167) and 16th in goals (44), while he ranks first among defensemen in club history in each category. Fortunus won the 2014 Calder Cup with Texas, while he also reached the Calder Cup Final in 2009 with Manitoba and again in 2010 with Texas. He was also named to the 2014-15 AHL All-Star Game. The native of La Prairie, Quebec, appeared in nine career NHL contests with Dallas during the 2009-10 and 2013-14 seasons, recording one assist (0-1=1). Additionally, he spent parts of two seasons with Louisiana of the ECHL from 2003-05, registering 42 points (11-31=42) in 123 games. Prior to his professional debut in 2003-04, Fortunus logged 148 points (40-108=148) in 285 career games in five seasons with Baie-Comeau Drakkar of the QMJHL, earning QMJHL First All-Star Team honors and winning the Emile Bouchard Trophy as the QMJHL's Defenseman of the Year in 2002-03.

RYAN DANIELS - Goaltending Coach (3rd Season)



Ryan Daniels was hired as the Goaltender Development Coach of the Texas Stars on June 8, 2021 after spending the previous three years with the Guelph Storm of the Ontario Hockey League. In his tenure, Guelph captured the 2019 OHL Championship and competed in the 2019 Memorial Cup.

He spent the previous three seasons as the Goaltending Coach for the Mississauga Steelheads, who won the Eastern Conference Championship in 2016-17. Prior to coaching in the OHL, Daniels spent time as the Goaltending Coach for the Toronto Patriots of the OJHL, who won back to back Buckland Cups.

Daniels played 5 seasons in the OHL for the Saginaw Spirit and Peterborough Petes and was drafted by the Ottawa Senators in the fifth round in 2006. He also played four varsity seasons at Wilfrid Laurier University, where he was named a 2nd Team All Canadian and a two time OUA West MVP. While at Wilfrid Laurier University, Daniels received his Bachelor of Business Administration with Honours. He was also an Academic All Canadian.

While at UST from 2021-23, he oversaw the Tommies' video coordination and analytics, community outreach and travel arrangements. The Ludington, Michigan native earned a sport management degree from the University of Michigan in 2020, where he also served as an analytics and video assistant for the Wolverines men's hockey program.
