TONIGHT'S GAME

The Texas Stars (24-18-3-2) are in Illinois tonight to take on the Rockford IceHogs (20-21-5-2) at 7:00 p.m. at the BMO Center.

Texas had a five-game point streak (3-0-1-1) snapped on Wednesday night, beginning a three-game road trip with a 1-0 loss at Grand Rapids. The Stars previously swept a weekend series against the Iowa Wild on Friday (6-4 W) and Saturday (3-2 W) at the H-E-B Center at Cedar Park.

Rockford is coming off a two-game road series in Des Moines against the Iowa Wild. Monday's series opener saw the IceHogs fall 3-1. Then on Wednesday, Rockford salvaged a split of the series by picking up a 3-1 win. The IceHogs are now 4-3-2-1 in their last 10 games.

The Stars are 3-1-1-0 against the IceHogs and 2-0-1-0 at the BMO Center this season. In eight meetings last year, Texas was 3-2-3-0 against Rockford during the regular season. Texas then swept Rockford with three wins (5-3, 4-1, 4-2) in a best-of-five series during the Central Division Semifinals.

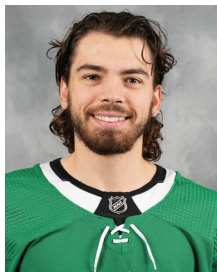
LAST TIME ON THE ICE...

The Texas Stars were shut out 1-0 by Sebastian Cossa and the Grand Rapids Griffins on Wednesday night at Van Andel Arena.

Grand Rapids scored the game's only goal 25 seconds into the contest when Albert Johansson fired a one-timer passed to the slot by Austin Czarnik past Remi Poirier. The opening period saw the Griffins outshoot the Stars 13-9.

After Texas was outshot for second straight period by a 14-7 margin, the Stars flipped the script and outshot the Griffins 12-6 in the final frame. However, Grand Rapids hung on to win 1-0 and climbed over Texas (53 points) to move to second in the AHL's Central Division with 54 points.

Earning the win in goal for the Griffins, Cossa improved to 11-7-5 with his first career AHL shutout following a 28-save showing. Poirier is now 13-9-3 after allowing one goal on 33 shots.



PLAYER SPOTLIGHT

Stars netminder Remi Poirier was outstanding in Texas' last game at Grand Rapids on Wednesday night, where he allowed only one goal on 33 shots. Despite making 32 of 33 saves in the contest, the Stars dropped a 1-0 decision in Michigan. Poirier's only AHL shutout was posted in Grand Rapids earlier this season, a 26-save showing on Dec. 13 in a 2-0 victory over the Griffins. Since the beginning of February, the Farnham, QC, native owns a 2.03 goal-against average, a .927 save percentage and 102 saves over four appearances.

HEAD-TO-HEAD

Tonight marks the sixth of eight regular-season games this season between the Stars and IceHogs.

The Stars finished last regular season with a 3-2-3-0 mark against the IceHogs, including a 1-1-2-0 mark at the BMO Center.

Texas bested Rockford three times, with 5-3, 4-1 and 4-2 victories, in a best-of-five series to open last year's Calder Cup Playoffs Central Division Semifinals.

Since the series began in 2009-10, Texas is edging Rockford in goal differential by a +2 margin, 247-245.

SERIES HISTORY

Texas and Rockford have met 75 times dating back to their first matchup on Nov. 13, 2009, where Texas skated away with a 4-0 road victory. The Stars own a 35-27-7-6 all-time record over the IceHogs.

In games played away from home against Rockford, Texas owns a record of 18-15-3-2 at the BMO Center.

The Texas Stars are 11-7 all-time against Rockford in the playoffs. The Stars and IceHogs have clashed in a postseason series a total of five times (2010, 2015, 2018, 2022, 2023), which is the most for the Stars against any single opponent.

NEWS & NOTES

BLANK SPACE

The Texas Stars saw their five-game point streak (3-0-1-1) come to an end on Wednesday at Grand Rapids as the Griffins shut out the Stars 1-0. It marked Texas' first time being shut out in a game since May 6, 2022, when Arvid Soderblom backstopped a 1-0 victory with 36 saves for the Rockford IceHogs in Game Two of the Central Division Quarterfinals. To pinpoint the last time the Stars were shutout in a regular season game, you'd have to go back to April 10, 2022, when Zane McIntyre turned all 38 shots aside in a 3-0 win for the Iowa Wild over Texas in Cedar Park.

The Stars have witnessed lesser production than they were accustomed to early in the season. Since the start of the new year, Texas has scored 51 goals in 19 games for an average of 2.68 goals per games. By comparison, the Stars were once leading the AHL on Jan. 1 with 114 goals scored through 28 games, averaging 4.07 goals per game.

Texas is currently tied for fifth with Cleveland and Toronto in the American Hockey League with 165 goals scored this season. The Stars have scored four or more goals 22 times in 47 games and have held opponents to three or less goals 28 times. When scoring three or more times, the Stars are 23-6-2-0 and 12-4-0-0 away from home. However, when scoring less they are 1-12-1-2 and 1-6-1-1 on the road.

SPECIAL POWER

The Texas Stars' power play has managed to hang around at second in the American Hockey League with a 22.6% (36-for-159) success rate. Stars forward Kyle McDonald once again leads all AHL rookies with nine power-play tallies this season (T-5th in entire AHL) after burying another on the advantage for the Stars' first goal last Friday night. Meanwhile, Logan Stankoven and Mavrik Bourque rank tied for sixth in the AHL with 14 power-play assists, respectively.

ROOKIE RUNAWAY

Stars rookie forward Logan Stankoven, who has posted 57 points in 47 games, continues to pace the entire AHL in scoring, leading teammate Mavrik Bourque (55) in the points race. The Kamloops, British Columbia, native ranks tied for second in the league with 24 goals and first among rookies in points (57), goals (24), assists (33), and shots on goal (151). He currently stands 20 points ahead of the players tied for second on the rookie leaderboard, Matt Coronato of Calgary and Samu Tuomala of Lehigh Valley.

MAVRIK'S APPLE TREE

At the top of the AHL leaderboard with 38 assists this season is Stars forward Mavrik Bourque. Additionally, the Plessisville, Quebec, native ranks second in the league while being two points shy of linemate Logan Stankoven (57) with 55 points (17-38=55). Bourque ranks tied for second in the AHL this season with 166 shots on goal.

DEBUTING IN DALLAS

Amid a number of injuries and complications with the Dallas Stars, the Texas Stars saw a pair of their defensemen in Alexander Petrovic and Derrick Pouliot earn call-ups to the NHL on Monday. Each skated in their Dallas debut Monday at TD Garden in Boston. Petrovic logged two hits and two shots on goal in 12:52 of ice time, while Pouliot blocked one shot in 13:17 of ice time. Dallas ultimately fell 4-3 in a shootout. Petrovic returned to Texas' roster on Tuesday while Pouliot remains with Dallas.

TEXAS TANDEM

Matt Murray and Remi Poirier have combined to start every game this season for the Texas Stars. So far through 47 games, Murray and Poirier have teamed up for a 3.10 goals-against average and .900 save percentage, and each has posted a shutout while combining for a 24-18-5 record.

Murray, 26, has appeared in 22 games this season, owns an 11-9-2 record, 2.91 GAA and .903 SV%. He's also earned multiple call-ups to Dallas, where he made one start and earned his first NHL shutout behind a 23-save showing in a 4-0 win at Minnesota on Jan. 8. The St. Albert, Alberta, native made 33 on 37 shots in Texas 6-4 victory on Friday night. In two starts prior to that on the Stars' recent road trip, he turned aside 47 of the 50 shots he faced and went 1-0-0-1.

Poirier, 22, has appeared in 26 games and now made back-to-back starts for Texas while holding a 13-9-3 record with a 3.03 GAA and .907 SV%. He made 24 saves on 26 shots in Saturday's 3-2 win over the Wild before making 32 stops in a 1-0 loss at Grand Rapids on Wednesday. The Farnham, Quebec, native earned his first career AHL shutout with 26 saves in a 2-0 win on Dec. 13 at Grand Rapids.

2023-24 COACHING STAFF



NEIL GRAHAM - Head Coach (5th Season)



Neil Graham was promoted to head coach of the Texas Stars on December 10, 2019 to fill the vacancy left by Derek Laxdal who was promoted to assistant coach of the Dallas Stars the same day. The following night he earned his first win as the head coach of the Stars, a 3-1 victory over Manitoba. He went on to finish the shortened season with an 18-15-2-2 record at the helm. Graham was previously hired as assistant coach of the Stars on July 8, 2019, joining the team for his first stint of coaching at the American Hockey League level. Graham, 38, led the Stars to their first Calder Cup playoff appearance since 2018 in 2021-22, ending with a first round loss to Rockford. He guided Texas to the top of the Central Division in 2022-23, as the Stars won their first division title since 2014. The Stars swept Rockford in the 2023 division semifinals before coming up just short against Milwaukee in the division finals.

Before making the move to Cedar Park, Texas, he served as head coach of the Idaho Steelheads, the ECHL affiliate of the Dallas Stars, from 2015 to 2019. Over that span, he amassed a 166-91-31 record in 288 regular-season contests and led Idaho to three consecutive 40-win seasons and guided the Steelheads to the Kelly Cup Playoffs in all four of his campaigns at the helm. The Calgary, Alberta native is a graduate of Mercyhurst University where he played four seasons before turning pro. Graham recorded 60 points (23-37=60) and 128 penalty minutes over 137 NCAA games. He turned pro in 2010 and split three seasons between the ECHL and Southern Professional Hockey League, accruing 98 points (42-56=98) in 113 professional games.

TRAVIS MORIN - Assistant Coach (5th Season)



Travis Morin was promoted to assistant coach of the Texas Stars on December 10, 2019. During the shortened 2019-2020 season, Morin stepped in for Head Coach Neil Graham for a pair of games and recorded a win in his debut commanding the bench, a 5-4 victory against Colorado on March 10, 2020.

Morin, 39, ended his playing career with the Texas Stars following the 2018-19 season after 10 years with the organization and 12 professional seasons overall. Morin retired as the Stars franchise leader in points (560), goals (175), assists (385), and games played (686). On Oct. 19, 2019, he became the first player in team history to have his jersey number (#23) retired. His 686 games played with the Stars are the most by any AHL player with one organization since 1974. The Brooklyn Park, Minnesota native captained the team during the 2015-16 and 2016-17 seasons, was a four-time AHL All-Star, and led the Stars in scoring across five of his 10 seasons. He was a focal point of Texas' 2014 Calder Cup Championship season, capturing the Les Cunningham Award (AHL MVP), John B. Sollenberger Award (Regular Season Scoring Leader), and Jack A. Butterfield Award (Calder Cup Playoff MVP) that season. Morin is also the organization's most decorated postseason scorer, earning 64 points (23-42=64) in 87 playoff games.

Morin is a graduate of Minnesota State University-Mankato where he played all four years before turning pro in 2007. Across 151 games at his alma mater, Morin recorded 133 points (58-75=133) and served as team captain in his senior season of 2006-07. Before joining the Stars, he also played for the South Carolina Stingrays in the ECHL and Hershey Bears from 2007 to 2009.

MAX FORTUNUS - Assistant Coach (3rd Season)



Max Fortunus was hired as assistant coach of the Texas Stars on May 20, 2021. It is his first coaching position following a 17-year professional career that spanned more than 1,100 regular season games in the NHL, AHL, DEL, and ECHL. Six of those seasons were spent with the Stars including a three-year stint as team captain. Fortunus, 40, moved behind the bench after spending the previous three seasons with Fischtown of the Deutsche Eishockey Liga (DEL), Germany's top professional hockey league. He recorded 50 points (7-43=50) in 139 career DEL games with Fischtown, serving as an assistant captain for all three seasons with the club from 2018-21.

Fortunus spent 15 seasons in the AHL where he amassed 286 points (76-210=286) in 882 career games with Houston, Manitoba, Texas, Iowa and Springfield. The former defenseman recorded 167 points (44-123=167) in 402 career games with Texas over six seasons from 2009-15. Fortunus was named Texas' captain from 2012-15. He ranks third in Texas Stars history in games played (402), fourth in assists (123), sixth in points (167) and 16th in goals (44), while he ranks first among defensemen in club history in each category. Fortunus won the 2014 Calder Cup with Texas, while he also reached the Calder Cup Final in 2009 with Manitoba and again in 2010 with Texas. He was also named to the 2014-15 AHL All-Star Game. The native of La Prairie, Quebec, appeared in nine career NHL contests with Dallas during the 2009-10 and 2013-14 seasons, recording one assist (0-1=1). Additionally, he spent parts of two seasons with Louisiana of the ECHL from 2003-05, registering 42 points (11-31=42) in 123 games. Prior to his professional debut in 2003-04, Fortunus logged 148 points (40-108=148) in 285 career games in five seasons with Baie-Comeau Drakkar of the QMJHL, earning QMJHL First All-Star Team honors and winning the Emile Bouchard Trophy as the QMJHL's Defenseman of the Year in 2002-03.

RYAN DANIELS - Goaltending Coach (3rd Season)



Ryan Daniels was hired as the Goaltender Development Coach of the Texas Stars on June 8, 2021 after spending the previous three years with the Guelph Storm of the Ontario Hockey League. In his tenure, Guelph captured the 2019 OHL Championship and competed in the 2019 Memorial Cup.

He spent the previous three seasons as the Goaltending Coach for the Mississauga Steelheads, who won the Eastern Conference Championship in 2016-17. Prior to coaching in the OHL, Daniels spent time as the Goaltending Coach for the Toronto Patriots of the OJHL, who won back to back Buckland Cups.

Daniels played 5 seasons in the OHL for the Saginaw Spirit and Peterborough Petes and was drafted by the Ottawa Senators in the fifth round in 2006. He also played four varsity seasons at Wilfrid Laurier University, where he was named a 2nd Team All Canadian and a two time OUA West MVP. While at Wilfrid Laurier University, Daniels received his Bachelor of Business Administration with Honours. He was also an Academic All Canadian.

JOSH JOHNSON - Video Coach (1st Season)



Josh Johnson was hired as the Texas Stars video coach in the summer of 2023 after spending two seasons as the director of hockey operations for the University of St Thomas men's hockey program. While at UST from 2021-23, he oversaw the Tommies' video coordination and analytics, community outreach and travel arrangements. Johnson previously served as the video coordinator for Robert Morris University in 2020-21, where he handled practice and game film, video breakdown and analytics.

The Ludington, Michigan native earned a sport management degree from the University of Michigan in 2020, where he also served as an analytics and video assistant for the Wolverines men's hockey program.
