2023-24 COACHING STAFF



NEIL GRAHAM - Head Coach (5th Season)



Neil Graham was promoted to head coach of the Texas Stars on December 10, 2019 to fill the vacancy left by Derek Laxdal who was promoted to assistant coach of the Dallas Stars the same day. The following night he earned his first win as the head coach of the Stars, a 3-1 victory over Manitoba. He went on to finish the shortened season with an 18-15-2-2 record at the helm. Graham was previously hired as assistant coach of the Stars on July 8, 2019, joining the team for his first stint of coaching at the American Hockey League level. Graham, 38, led the Stars to their first Calder Cup playoff appearance since 2018 in 2021-22, ending with a first round loss to Rockford. He guided Texas to the top of the Central Division in 2022-23, as the Stars won their first division title since 2014. The Stars swept Rockford in the 2023 division semifinals before coming up just short against Milwaukee in the division finals.

Before making the move to Cedar Park, Texas, he served as head coach of the Idaho Steelheads, the ECHL affiliate of the Dallas Stars, from 2015 to 2019. Over that span, he amassed a 166-91-31 record in 288 regular-season contests and led Idaho to three consecutive 40-win seasons and guided the Steelheads to the Kelly Cup Playoffs in all four of his campaigns at the helm. The Calgary, Alberta native is a graduate of Mercyhurst University where he played four seasons before turning pro. Graham recorded 60 points (23-37=60) and 128 penalty minutes over 137 NCAA games. He turned pro in 2010 and split three seasons between the ECHL and Southern Professional Hockey League, accruing 98 points (42-56=98) in 113 professional games.

TRAVIS MORIN - Assistant Coach (5th Season)



Travis Morin was promoted to assistant coach of the Texas Stars on December 10, 2019. During the shortened 2019-2020 season, Morin stepped in for Head Coach Neil Graham for a pair of games and recorded a win in his debut commanding the bench, a 5-4 victory against Colorado on March 10, 2020.

Morin, 39, ended his playing career with the Texas Stars following the 2018-19 season after 10 years with the organization and 12 professional seasons overall. Morin retired as the Stars franchise leader in points (560), goals (175), assists (385), and games played (686). On Oct. 19, 2019, he became the first player in team history to have his jersey number (#23) retired. His 686 games played with the Stars are the most by any AHL player with one organization since 1974. The Brooklyn Park, Minnesota native captained the team during the 2015-16 and 2016-17 seasons, was a four-time AHL All-Star, and led the Stars in scoring across five of his 10 seasons. He was a focal point of Texas' 2014 Calder Cup Championship season, capturing the Les Cunningham Award (AHL MVP), John B. Sollenberger Award (Regular Season Scoring Leader), and Jack A. Butterfield Award (Calder Cup Playoff MVP) that season. Morin is also the organization's most decorated postseason scorer, earning 64 points (23-42=64) in 87 playoff games.

Morin is a graduate of Minnesota State University-Mankato where he played all four years before turning pro in 2007. Across 151 games at his alma mater, Morin recorded 133 points (58-75=133) and served as team captain in his senior season of 2006-07. Before joining the Stars, he also played for the South Carolina Stingrays in the ECHL and Hershey Bears from 2007 to 2009.

MAX FORTUNUS - Assistant Coach (3rd Season)



Max Fortunas was hired as assistant coach of the Texas Stars on May 20, 2021. It is his first coaching position following a 17-year professional career that spanned more than 1,100 regular season games in the NHL, AHL, DEL, and ECHL. Six of those seasons were spent with the Stars including a three-year stint as team captain. Fortunas, 40, moved behind the bench after spending the previous three seasons with Fischtown of the Deutsche Eishockey Liga (DEL), Germany's top professional hockey league. He recorded 50 points (7-43=50) in 139 career DEL games with Fischtown, serving as an assistant captain for all three seasons with the club from 2018-21.

Fortunas spent 15 seasons in the AHL where he amassed 286 points (76-210=286) in 882 career games with Houston, Manitoba, Texas, Iowa and Springfield. The former defenseman recorded 167 points (44-123=167) in 402 career games with Texas over six seasons from 2009-15. Fortunas was named Texas' captain from 2012-15. He ranks third in Texas Stars history in games played (402), fourth in assists (123), sixth in points (167) and 16th in goals (44), while he ranks first among defensemen in club history in each category. Fortunas won the 2014 Calder Cup with Texas, while he also reached the Calder Cup Final in 2009 with Manitoba and again in 2010 with Texas. He was also named to the 2014-15 AHL All-Star Game. The native of La Prairie, Quebec, appeared in nine career NHL contests with Dallas during the 2009-10 and 2013-14 seasons, recording one assist (0-1=1). Additionally, he spent parts of two seasons with Louisiana of the ECHL from 2003-05, registering 42 points (11-31=42) in 123 games. Prior to his professional debut in 2003-04, Fortunas logged 148 points (40-108=148) in 285 career games in five seasons with Baie-Comeau Drakkar of the QMJHL, earning QMJHL First All-Star Team honors and winning the Emile Bouchard Trophy as the QMJHL's Defenseman of the Year in 2002-03.

RYAN DANIELS - Goaltending Coach (3rd Season)



Ryan Daniels was hired as the Goaltender Development Coach of the Texas Stars on June 8, 2021 after spending the previous three years with the Guelph Storm of the Ontario Hockey League. In his tenure, Guelph captured the 2019 OHL Championship and competed in the 2019 Memorial Cup.

He spent the previous three seasons as the Goaltending Coach for the Mississauga Steelheads, who won the Eastern Conference Championship in 2016-17. Prior to coaching in the OHL, Daniels spent time as the Goaltending Coach for the Toronto Patriots of the OJHL, who won back to back Buckland Cups.

Daniels played 5 seasons in the OHL for the Saginaw Spirit and Peterborough Petes and was drafted by the Ottawa Senators in the fifth round in 2006. He also played four varsity seasons at Wilfrid Laurier University, where he was named a 2nd Team All Canadian and a two time OUA West MVP. While at Wilfrid Laurier University, Daniels received his Bachelor of Business Administration with Honours. He was also an Academic All Canadian.

JOSH JOHNSON - Video Coach (1st Season)



Josh Johnson was hired as the Texas Stars video coach in the summer of 2023 after spending two seasons as the director of hockey operations for the University of St Thomas men's hockey program. While at UST from 2021-23, he oversaw the Tommies' video coordination and analytics, community outreach and travel arrangements. Johnson previously served as the video coordinator for Robert Morris University in 2020-21, where he handled practice and game film, video breakdown and analytics.

The Ludington, Michigan native earned a sport management degree from the University of Michigan in 2020, where he also served as an analytics and video assistant for the Wolverines men's hockey program.

TONIGHT'S GAME

The Texas Stars (4-3-1-1) are in Rockford, Illinois, this morning to take on the Rockford IceHogs (5-2-0-0) at the BMO Center at 10:30 a.m.

Texas is coming into Wednesday morning's tilt after splitting a series with the Iowa Wild in Des Moines. After shutting out the Wild, 4-0, behind a 30-save showing on Saturday to take the first game, Iowa snagged a 4-2 victory in the finale on Sunday afternoon at Wells Fargo Arena.

Rockford is streaking while being one of three teams in the American Hockey League riding a four-game winning streak. Most recently, the IceHogs swept the Manitoba Moose, picking up 4-3 and 4-1 victories north of the border.

In eight meetings last season, the Stars were 3-1-3-1 against the IceHogs, which included a 1-1-2-0 mark in games played at the BMO Center in Rockford, Illinois. Additionally, Texas picked up another pair of wins in the Land of Lincoln on the way to sweeping a best-of-five series to open the 2023 playoffs.

LAST TIME ON THE ICE...

The Texas Stars saw their six-game point streak end with a 4-2 loss to the Iowa Wild on Sunday afternoon at Wells Fargo Arena.

The Wild scored their first goal of the weekend to strike first in Sunday's contest when Jake Lucchini tapped in a cross-crease pass from Sammy Walker on a power play with 21 seconds left in the opening period. Despite trailing 1-0 after 20 minutes of action, the Stars owned a 9-8 edge in shots on goal over the Wild.

The second period saw Steven Fogarty extend Iowa's lead to 2-0 at 2:29 by scoring a second power-play goal for the Wild off a feed across the slot by Walker. The Stars cut the deficit to 2-1 at 5:04 when **Mavrik Bourque** jammed in a loose puck on a man advantage after the initial shot by **Kyle McDonald** snuck behind Jesper Wallstedt. Scoring his first professional goal in North America, **Lian Bichsel** tied the game 2-2 when he snapped in a shot from the right point for the fourth power-play goal of the game at the 17:13 mark.

In the third period, Iowa reclaimed the lead at 9:16 when Adam Beckman tapped in a pass from Lucchini past **Matt Murray** to make it 3-2 Wild. Then with 1:59 remaining, Greg Meireles scored an empty-net goal from the opposite end of the ice to seal a 4-2 victory for the Wild.



PLAYER SPOTLIGHT

Rookie **Lian Bichsel** has been a force for Texas in his first season in North America. The 6-foot-6 native of Olten, Switzerland was Dallas' first round pick (18th overall) in 2022 and has four points in his first six AHL games. Bichsel registered his first multi-point game Saturday in Des Moines, tallying two assists in 4-0 win against the Iowa Wild. In Sunday's rematch, the defenseman scored his first career goal, a blast from the point on a power play. He paces the Stars defensemen with 4 points and leads the entire team with 16 PIMs.

HEAD-TO-HEAD

Tonight marks the first of eight regular-season games this season between the Stars and IceHogs.

The Stars finished last regular season with a 3-2-3-0 mark against the IceHogs, including a 1-1-2-0 mark at the BMO Center.

Texas bested Rockford three times, with 5-3, 4-1 and 4-2 victories, in a best-of-five series to open last year's Calder Cup Playoffs Central Division Semifinals.

Since the series' began in 2009-10, Rockford is edging Texas in goal differential by a +3 margin, 233-230.

SERIES HISTORY

Texas and Rockford have met 70 times dating back to their first matchup on Nov. 13, 2009, where Texas skated away with a 4-0 road victory. The Stars own a 32-26-6-6 all-time record over the IceHogs.

In games played on the road against Rockford, Texas owns a record of 16-15-2-2 at the BMO Center.

After winning three times last year in a five-game series to open the playoffs, Texas is now 11-7 all-time against Rockford in the playoffs. The Stars and IceHogs have clashed in a postseason series a total of five times (2010, 2015, 2018, 2022, 2023).

NEWS & NOTES

TEXAS' MIDWEST TOUR

Struggling on home ice to start the season, the Texas Stars have been most dominant while competing outside the Lone Star State. Grasping a 4-3-1-1 overall mark so far, the Stars are 4-1 in road games after suffering their first loss away from home, 4-2, on Sunday afternoon in Des Moines, snapping a three-game road winning streak and six-game point streak overall. Texas opened the road series with a 4-0 win over Iowa to move into a tie for first in the American Hockey League with four road victories.

While skating on enemy ice this season, Texas has outscored opponents by a 19-11 margin, and owns a 23.5 percent (4-for-17) success rate on the power play in games played on the road. The Stars' 19 goals through five road tests, which averages out at 3.8 goals per game, can be compared to a rate of 10 goals in four home games, resulting in a 2.5 clip for goals per game.

SNAKE EYES & DEUCES WILD

Two of the Dallas Stars' most highly regarded prospects in Logan Stankoven and Mavrik Bourque have shined in Texas. In nine games early this season, both forwards have put up 13 points to tie for fifth on the American Hockey League leaderboard. While guiding Texas' offense, both forwards have only been held off the scoresheet twice, having recorded at least one point in seven of the Stars' nine games.

Stankoven, 20, leads AHL rookies in goals (6) and points (6-7=13) through nine games played this season. The Kamloops, British Columbia, native rides a current two-game point streak (1-3=4) after posting a three-point night (1-2=4) at Iowa on Saturday before recording an assist in Sunday's affair. Additionally, the right-handed forward is a threat when the Stars have the man advantage, with a pair of power-play tallies, which ranks tied for first among rookies and tied for 11th among all AHL players. Stankoven was picked by Dallas in the second round, 47th overall in the 2021 National Hockey League Draft.

Bourque, 21, also appears on several AHL leaderboards this season, including being tied for fifth in points (13), tied for 10th in assists (8) and a tie for 14th in goals (5). The native of Plessisville, Quebec, mounted a two-game point streak (2-3=5) by posting a goal and an assist in Sunday's finale in Des Moines. Bourque was selected by Dallas in the first round, 30th overall in the 2020 NHL Draft.

GUARDIANS OF TEXAS' GALAXY

Second-year netminders Matt Murray and Remi Poirier have picked up where they left off last season, combining for a 4-3-2 record, a 2.60 goals-against average and .916 save percentage. Trading starts constantly to begin the season, Texas' last game was an exception to the pattern once Matt Murray made consecutive starts at Iowa after posting a 30-save shutout in Saturday's 4-0 victory over the Wild.

Murray, 25, is holding it down statistically with five starts so far for the Stars. The St. Albert, Alberta, native owns 2-2-1 mark this season, with one shutout (T-1st AHL), 1.80 GAA (8th AHL) and a .938 SV% (T-5th AHL).

Poirier, 22, has made four starts for Texas and sports a 2-1-1 record with a 3.41 GAA and .899 SV%.

Last season saw six different goaltenders sport victory green and combine for a 40-20-9-3 record, three shutouts (all recorded by Murray), a 2.83 goals-against average and an .899 save percentage.

STREAKY SPECIAL TEAMS

The Texas Stars power play has shown promise early in the 2023-24 campaign. The Stars have scored at least one goal while on the advantage in six of their nine times out on the ice. Heading into Des Moines last weekend, Texas was streaking with one power-play marker in four straight contests. After being denied twice on the power play in Saturday's game, the Stars bounced back and notched their first multi-power-play goal game, scoring twice on four chances in Sunday's game.

Texas now stands at a 7-for-35 (20.0%) clip and jumped up to 11th in the American Hockey League following the breakout special teams showing on Sunday.

On the other end of the ice, Texas' penalty kill has turned it on as of late, but suffered a setback on Sunday. With 18 opportunities to kill off a penalty in the last five games, the Stars have been successful 14 times after allowing a pair of power-play goals on three kills last Sunday. In total this season, the Stars are 22-for-29 (75.9%) and fell back to 26th in the AHL last time out. Additionally, Texas is one of 14 teams that has yet to log a shorthanded goal this season.
