GAME NOTES

- **DANCES WITH WOLVES:** Rockford opened the series against Chicago with five consecutive victories for the first time in team history (previous record was three games to open the series). The five-game win streak is also the team's overall longest win streak against the Wolves in team history, surpassing the previous record of four straight victories against Chicago from Nov. 20 - Dec. 27, 2009
- **TWO FOR YOU:** The IceHogs have limited the Wolves to two or fewer goals in 10 of the last 13 games. That stretch includes four of six games this season, and the Hogs' only loss to the Wolves this season came in the form of a 3-2 loss on Jan. 5 at the BMO Harris Bank Center.
- **SIK 'EM:** Tyler Sikura was a -2 in Friday's loss to the Griffins. It was just the second time in his last 17 games that Sikura had failed to register an even-or-better plus/minus rating. Sikura's +6 rating on the season ranks tied for second on the IceHogs roster behind only John Quenneville (+7). Additionally, Sikura has been a plus player in every game against the Chicago Wolves except the teams' first meeting on Oct. 18.
- **THREE FOR ME:** The IceHogs have only managed to score three goals in a game twice in the last 12 contests. The club holds a record of 16-1-0-1 record when scoring more than two goals this year and are 3-18-1-0 when tallying two or fewer goals. Dating to last season, the Hogs have won 46 of 52 games when scoring more than two goals.
- **HOT SHOT HAGEL:** Brandon Hagel was recalled by the Chicago Blackhawks and will be the 120th Rockford IceHogs alum to reach/return to the National Hockey League after suiting up for the club's American Hockey League affiliate if he dresses during his recall.

However, the IceHogs have taken five of the six matchups against Chicago this season. The Wolves are led in scoring by rookie Lucas Elvenes, who boasts 33 points (8g, 25a) through 42 contests.

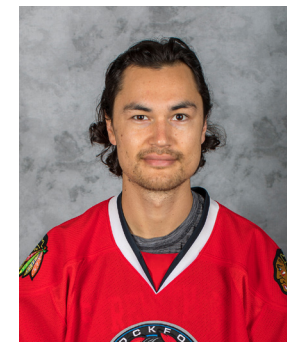
