## GAME NOTES

- **TWO FOR YOU:** The IceHogs have limited the Wolves to two or fewer goals in nine of the last 11 games. That stretch includes three of four games this season after the Hogs held Chicago to one goal in the most recent meeting of the series on Nov. 10 (4-1 win).
- **FOUR SCORE:** The IceHogs enter Friday's game tied for the franchise's longest win streak overall against Chicago with four straight wins. The only other time in team history in which the Hogs won four straight games against the Wolves was Nov. 20 - Dec. 27, 2009.
- **HOME IS WHERE THE HOG IS:** Rockford has won six of its last seven home games, with its only loss in that span a 4-0 shutout on Nov. 8 against Manitoba. Overall, the IceHogs' six total home wins are tied for the third-most in the Western Conference and are just two wins shy of the conference's top win total from Milwaukee (8) and Tucson (8).
- **POWER UP:** Despite ranking 26th in the AHL in power-play percentage, the IceHogs enter Friday with seven power-play goals over their last nine games. The Hogs scored just one power-play goal over their first nine games of the season prior to the current stretch.
- **TOMMY BOY:** Matt Tomkins is riding his first career AHL win streak following last Sunday's OT win against San Antonio. The netminder has turned aside 39 of 42 pucks over those two victories while posting a 1.52 GAA with a .929 save percentage.
- **TONIGHT'S PROMOTION:** The IceHogs host their second annual Hockey Fights Cancer Night and will don specialty jerseys for the contest. Proceeds from the night will benefit SwedishAmerican Foundation.
