GAME NOTES

- TREE TURTY TREE: Fourteen of the last 15 matchups between the IceHogs and Monsters have featured at least one team scoring three or more goals. In this season's series, the Monsters have scored 3+ goals in each of the first two games against Rockford.
- **HOME IS WHERE THE HOG IS:** The Hogs have won 11 of their last 13 home games since Oct. 18. Rockford is now 11-4-0-0 at home this season and its 11 home wins are tied for third in the entire AHL behind only Milwaukee (12) and Toronto (12).
- **3 FOR ME:** Rockford improved to 15-0-0-1 when scoring at least three goals with a 4-2 win Friday. Dating to the beginning of last season, the IceHogs have won 45 of 50 games when scoring more than two goals. The Hogs also have points in 48 of those 50 games with a record of 45-2-1-2 when tallying at least three markers.
- ON THE UP & UP: Rockford has won eight of its last 10 games and is second in the AHL in total wins over the last 10 games behind only Tucson (9-1-0-0). The Hogs have now gone 21 consecutive contests without suffering back-to-back losses, posting a 15-5-0-1 record in that stretch.
- **KILLING IN THE NAME OF:** The IceHogs are perfect on the penalty kill in six of the last seven games, including a stretch of killing 18 consecutive power plays from Dec. 6-15. Dating further back to the final game of November, Rockford has killed 34 of the last 36 opposing power plays (94.4%) over the last nine games.
- **TONIGHT'S PROMOTION:** Star Wars Night features a Jedi Hammy doll available at Oink Outfitters and appearances by the 501st Legion.


