GAME NOTES

- **STAR WARS:** The Texas Stars lost a season-high 10 consecutive games from Oct. 26-Nov. 22 and were dead last in the entire AHL with a record of 3-13-0-2 until they met the Rockford IceHogs on Nov. 23. The Stars won that game 7-6 in a shootout and have since climbed up the standings, going 18-7-2-0. They now sit in a tie for fourth in the Central Division.
- A TALE OF TWO SEASONS: From the IceHogs' season-opener on Oct. 4 through Dec. 20, the IceHogs held an overall record of 17-10-0-1 and reached as high as second place in the Central Division. However, since Dec. 21, Rockford has won just three matchups, going 3-14-1-1 in that span and falling to a tie for sixth place in the Central.
- MAKE IT COUNT: The IceHogs sat dead last in the AHL with a power-play of 10.3% after going five straight games without a goal on the man-advantage from Jan. 15-Jan. 22. However, the Hogs buried four goals on twelve attempts in a home-and-home against the Admirals from Jan. 24-25 and followed it with another power-play goal on three chances Friday against the Moose. Rockford is now 5-for-18 (27.8%) with the extra man across their last four matchups and has jumped to 30th in the league with an 11.9% success rate on the season.
- HOT SHOT HAGEL: After weathering a six-game goalless skid from Jan. 10 22, Brandon Hagel has since netted three goals in the last four games, including a goal against the Milwaukee Admirals on Jan. 24 and scores Friday against Manitoba and Saturday against Milwaukee. With the tallies, Hagel has now jumped into sole possession of sixth in the American Hockey League in rookie goal-scoring with 16 tallies.
