GAME NOTES

- **TRAINED KILLERS:** The IceHogs buried a power-play goal in Friday's win against Grand Rapids to mark just the second goal scored on the man-advantage by either team in the season series since Nov. 15. In total between the two teams, only five power-play goals have been scored across 66 opportunities (7.6%) in 2019-20. Through nine games this season, the IceHogs have killed off 28 of 31 Griffins chances with the extra man for a penalty kill rate of 90.3%.
- **NOT A BIG DELIA:** Collin Delia stopped each of the 34 shots he faced on Friday to earn his third shutout of the season and fourth of his professional career. He's the first IceHogs goaltender to register three or more shutouts in a season since Michael Leighton blanked the opposition five times in both 2014-15 and again in 2015-16. Delia is just the fifth netminder in IceHogs AHL history to record three or more shutouts in a season (Leighton, Hutton, Toivanen, Crawford).
- **BRENN THERE, DONE THAT:** Defenseman T.J. Brennan notched two assists in Friday's win over Grand Rapids to extend his lead on the roster in career points against the Griffins with 24 (11g, 13a) through 19 contests. His 677 AHL games usurped Garrett Mitchell's 415 to make him the most experienced player on the team when the IceHogs acquired him at the trade deadline. He previously played 54 games with the Hogs during 2014-15, contributing 36 points (9g, 27a).
- GOTTA GET ON THE GOOD FOOT: The IceHogs defeated the Grand Rapids Griffins on Friday after leading 1-0 heading into the first intermission. Rockford boasts a record of 12-3-1-0 this season when leading after the opening frame.


