*Pentecost Vigil:

This is one of four responsorial Psalms of the prolonged celebration of Pentecost Mass in the form of a **Vigil**, whose character is not baptismal as in the Easter Vigil, but one of urgent prayer for the coming of the Holy Spirit.

**Refrain note:

Throughout the Easter Season, "Alleluia" is the alternate congregational response for the Responsorial Psalm. This option may be chosen beginning with the Mass of Easter Day through the Vigil of Pentecost.
