#### THE ORDER OF MASS

#### INTRODUCTORY RITES

#### **GREETING**

All stand. When the people are gathered, the Priest approaches the alter with the ministers while the Entrance Chant is sung.

When the Entrance Chant is concluded, the Priest and the faithful, sanding ogr themselves with the Sign of the Cross, while the Priest, facing the people says:

In the name of the Father,

and of the Son, and of the Holy Spirit

The People respond: Amen.



#### Then the Priest greets the people saying:

The grace of our Lord Jesus Christ and the love of God, and the community of the Holy Spirit be with you all.

#### Or:

Grace to you and peace from God our Father and the Gord Jesus Christ.

The Lord be with you.

The people reply: And with your spirit.



In this first greeting a Bishop, in tead of The Lord be with you, says: Peace be with you.

#### RITE OF BLESSING AND SPAINKLE G OF WATER

On Sundays, especially in Easter Time, instead of the customary Penitential Act, the blessing and sprinkling of water may take place as a reminder of Baptism.

#### PENITENTIAL ACT

The Priest invites the faithful to the Penitential Act, saying:

Brethren (brothers and sisters), let us acknowledge our sins, and so prepare ourselves to celebrate the sacred mysteries.

A brief pause for silence follows.

#### FORM 1:







The psalmist or cartor sings or says the Pealm, with the people making the response

#### SECOND READING

On Sunday and Solemnities a reader reads the Second Reading from the ambo, as above. To relicate learned of the reading, the reader acclaims. The word of the Lord. All reply: Thanks be to God.



#### **GOSPEL ACCLAMATION**

#### All stand.







# RITE OF EUCHARISTIC EXPOSITION AND BENEDICTION

#### **EXPOSITION**

After the people have assembled, O salutaris Hostia (hymn (14) or another song may be sung while the minister comes to the altar.

The ciborium or monstrance should be placed upon the table of the star which is covered with a cloth. After exposition, if the abstrance is used, the master incenses the sacrament. If the adoration is to be leading, he may then wandraw.

In the case of more solemn and lengthy constant, the last should be consecrated in the Mass which immediately precedent the exposuron and the communion should be placed in the monstrance upon the altar. #### **ADORATION**

During the exposition there should be prayers, songs, and readings to direct the attention of the faithful to the wearing of Christ the Lord.

Afterward the minister rises and sings or says: Let us pray.

Lord Jesus Christ, you gave us the eucharist as the memorial of your suffering and death. May our worship of this sacrament of your body and blood help us to experience the salvation you won for us

and the peace of the kingdom where you live with the Father and the Holy Spirit, one God, for ever and ever.

All respond: Amen.

All: O Josus, we are about to walk with You through the states of Your agony and Josus. We are about to spend a brief time renewing the sacrifice that gave us the life of a Christian, that upholos us by the graces You have won, and brings us along the road to a salvation that all took place and continues today by Your sacrifice on the cross. Help us to understand a little better, to love a little more, and to give of ourselves more governously by our use of these fifteen remembrances of Your divine rocation. Amen.

# FIRST STATION: JESUS IN THE GALDEN OF GETHSEMANE Sing or say: We adore You, Orbrist ...

Then Jesus came with them to a place caned Gethsemane, and he said to his disciples, "Sit here while I go over there and pray." He took along Peter and the two sons of Zebedee, and began to feel sorrow and distress. Then he said to them, "My soul is sorrowful even to death. Remain here and keep watch with me." He advanced a little and fell prostrate in prayer, saying, "My Father, if it is possible, let this cup pass from me; yet, not as I will, but as you will." When he returned to his disciples he found them asleep. He said to Peter, "So you could not keep watch with me for one hour? Watch and pray that you may not undergo the test. The spirit is willing, but the flesh is weak."
