

Behavior Policy during Remote Instruction

The King Center Charter School (KCCS) prides itself on a community of kind, respectful learners while in the building and outside of the building. During remote instruction it is important that we continue to follow all rules in the Student Discipline Policy as well as rules of online etiquette. The KCCS community will still be held responsible for all policies in the Student Discipline Policy with special attention to the areas that would affect the effectiveness of online learning such as the inappropriate use of technology, inappropriate language and inappropriate actions. Examples could include, but not limited to, inappropriate searches on a KCCS device, being disruptive in a live lesson or in the chat and cyberbullying.

If students are in violation of any policy, teachers will provide students with a warning and a deduction of Liveschool points. If the violation is egregious, referral to the Dean of Students will be made immediately. Teachers will also contact families for low-level violations. If the behavior is continuous, teachers will contact the Dean of Students for support.

The Dean of Students will work with the staff & student to discuss the infraction in detail. The Dean will then make a decision as to what an appropriate consequence may be while in remote instruction. Consequences may include additional Liveschool deductions, Character Education classes, parent/family meetings, Restorative Justice mediations, or suspension from live instruction. Other, more egregious violations of the KCCS Student Discipline Policy as written in the Parent Handbook could result in serious consequences.
