Mission Internship 2019

Job Description

Position

The Mission Intern program, which is funded by the Mission Committee, will employ 4-6 interns this summer. This program will allow interns to participate in local Christian mission work, to grow spiritually, and to experience and learn about the mission of the church of Jesus Christ.

Compensation

\$8.60 per hour for first-year intern for approximately 240 hours of scheduled work.

\$9.60 per hour for second-year intern for approximately 240 hours of scheduled work.

Term

This position will begin June 2, 2019 and continue through August 4, 2019. Each intern will be expected to complete an approximate average of 30 hours per week for the duration of the program.

Reporting

Interns will work in close cooperation and meet with scheduled staff and Mission Committee members each Sunday.

Description of Duties

Interns are expected to:

- **Regularly attend worship** in the Sanctuary at Ladue Chapel on Sundays at either worship service;
- **Attend a scheduled training session; participate in weekly intern meetings** each Sunday for the duration of the intern program;
- **Write a weekly, one-pager.** Interns will be given a prompt each week that will help them reflect on their experience as a Mission Intern. One-pagers will be due each Sunday during the check-in time.
- **Commit to Standards of Ethical Conduct** for members and employees of the Presbyterian Church (U.S.A.). The Standards are available in the church office or at: <http://www.pcusa.org/resource/standards-ethical-conduct/>

Qualifications

- At least entering your senior year in high school
- Be an active member of Ladue Chapel
- Be responsible, reliable, and trustworthy in character
- Have an interest and commitment to mission work, in general, and specifically to the mission work of Ladue Chapel
- Have reliable transportation
- No more than one year prior service as Ladue Chapel Mission Intern

Priority will be given to those who are participating regularly in the life of the church and are, or have been, actively involved in the youth program.
