



# BOROUGH OF Longport IS GETTING THE LEAD OUT

Atlantic County, NJ

Longport Borough is committed to providing clean, safe, and reliable drinking water for all our residents. In compliance with New Jersey's Lead Service Line Replacement Law, enacted in 2021, Longport Borough has launched a Lead Service Line Replacement Program (LSLR) to identify and remove lead or galvanized service lines (pipes) in the drinking water utility system and to educate the public on how to reduce their exposure to lead in drinking water.

All residents in Longport's water service area with lead service lines are automatically enrolled in the lead service line replacement program. **You do not need to sign up to enroll in the program, but there are steps you need to take to participate.** Inspections and replacements, as needed, will be performed at no direct cost to residents. New construction and reconstruction projects will need to submit an inquiry for verification.

This is a boroughwide program with a rolling process. We will be working block by block, and we'll let you know in advance when your block is scheduled. **This work has not yet begun, but now is the time to get ready.**

Here is what you can do using Longport Borough's LSLR dedicated website (<https://lslrprogram.com/longport/>)

**Self-report service line material** using detailed instructions provided to capture pictures

**Sign an access agreement** to permit inspectors to inspect the line material in your home

**Learn how to reduce your exposure to lead** in drinking water

**Track the status** of the inspections/replacements using the online map & find out where the work is going on

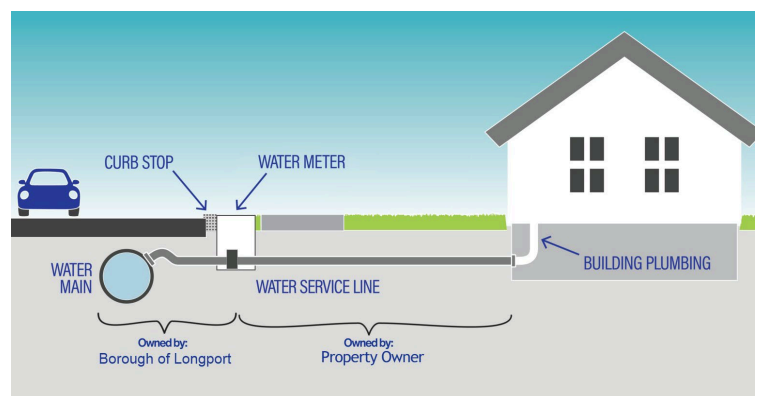

*Homeowners also have the option to replace their service line at their own cost. Whichever option the homeowner chooses, under Borough Ordinance, all lead/galvanized service lines must be replaced.*

## What is a water service line and who owns it?

Water service lines are the pipes that carry water from the Borough of Longport's pipes in the street into homes/buildings. Longport owns the water service lines from the main in the streets to the water meter. Individual property owners own the service line from the water meter into the structure.





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**Next Steps** – what to expect depends on the action **you** take:

## If you **self-report service line material** through the LSLR website

Our professionals will review your information and we will contact you if we have any questions. Information is provided below on the next steps if your water line is found to contain lead or galvanized material.. *You may also need to sign an access agreement form if additional inspections or replacements are required.*

## If you **sign an access agreement** through the LSLR website to permit inspectors to inspect the line material

Our contractor will contact you to set up a time to inspect the pipe where the water service enters your home. Phase 1 is planned to begin in Spring 2026. The visit only takes a few minutes, and if your service is accessible from outside (for example, through a crawl space), you do not need to be home for the check. Inspectors will gladly provide their credentials upon request. Information is provided below on the next steps if your water line is found to contain lead or galvanized material.

## If you **wait for the Borough’s contractor to contact you** to sign an access agreement for permission to inspect

They will reach out to you (via door knocking, sending letters, and leaving door hangers) to provide additional information on signing an access agreement and setting up an inspection.

## What happens next if I have a lead service line?

If your water line was found to contain lead or galvanized material, our contractor will contact you to schedule a date for your replacement, at no direct cost to you.
