

**IMPORTANT PARKING NOTICE – PLEASE READ
ALL VEHICLES MUST BE REMOVED FROM ROADWAYS BEGINNING
SATURDAY AT 5:00 PM THROUGH MONDAY AT 5:00 PM.
ANY VEHICLE IMPEDING SNOW REMOVAL OPERATIONS MAY BE SUBJECT TO
FINES AND/OR TOWING AT THE OWNER’S EXPENSE.**

Please move additional vehicles to overflow parking and place vehicles in your garage to expedite removal.

With forecasts currently calling for **10 to 15 inches of snow with potential ice accumulations**, we ask all residents to take the following precautions and comply with parking restrictions to ensure safety and allow for effective snow removal operations.

For all-electric homes, there are a few additional precautions that may help reduce the risk of frozen pipes in the event of a power outage during extreme cold:

- Raise the thermostat slightly before the storm to help build residual heat in the home (no need to overdo it—just a modest increase).
- Shut off and drain exterior hose bibs if this has not already been done.
- Leave interior doors open, especially to bathrooms and kitchens, to allow warm air to circulate around plumbing.
- Locate your main water shutoff valve in advance so it can be turned off quickly if a pipe were to freeze or burst.
- If power is lost for an extended period, consider shutting off the water supply as a precaution.
- Continue letting faucets drip and opening cabinet doors, as previously mentioned.

If conditions worsen or an outage becomes prolonged, the Willow Warming Center remains a good option. We will continue to share updates as they become available.

Please stay safe as more information will follow during the storm.
