INDEPENDENT AUDITORS' REPORT

Report on the Financial Statements

We have audited the accompanying financial statements of the business-type activities and each major fund of the Housing Authority of the Town of Windsor, as of and for the year ended December 31, 2016, and the related notes to the financial statements, which collectively comprise the Authority's basic financial statements as listed in the table of contents.

Management's Responsibility for the Financial Statements

Management is responsible for the preparation and fair presentation of these financial statements in accordance with accounting principles generally accepted in the United States of America; this includes the design, implementation, and maintenance of internal control relevant to the preparation and fair presentation of financial statements that are free from material misstatement, whether due to fraud or error.

Auditor's Responsibility

Our responsibility is to express opinions on these financial statements based on our audit. We conducted our audit in accordance with auditing standards generally accepted in the United States of America. Those standards require that we plan and perform the audit to obtain reasonable assurance about whether the financial statements are free from material misstatement.

An audit involves performing procedures to obtain audit evidence about the amounts and disclosures in the financial statements. The procedures selected depend on the auditor's judgment, including the assessment of the risks of material misstatement of the financial statements, whether due to fraud or error. In making those risk assessments, the auditor considers internal control relevant to the entity's preparation and fair presentation of the financial statements in order to design audit procedures that are appropriate in the circumstances, but not for the purpose of expressing an opinion on the effectiveness of the entity's internal control. Accordingly, we express no such opinion. An audit also includes evaluating the appropriateness of accounting policies used and the reasonableness of significant accounting estimates made by management, as well as evaluating the overall presentation of the financial statements.

We believe that the audit evidence we have obtained is sufficient and appropriate to provide a basis for our audit opinions.

Opinions

In our opinion, the financial statements referred to above present fairly, in all material respects, the respective financial position of the business-type activities and each major fund of the Housing Authority of the Town of Windsor, as of December 31, 2016, and the respective changes in financial position, and, where applicable, cash flows thereof for the year then ended in accordance with accounting principles generally accepted in the United States of America.

Other Matters

Required Supplementary Information

Management has omitted the management's discussion and analysis that accounting principles generally accepted in the United States of America require to be presented to supplement the basic financial statements. Such missing information, although not a part of the basic financial statements, is required by the Governmental Accounting Standards Board who considers it to be an essential part of financial reporting for placing the basic financial statements in an appropriate operational, economic, or historical context. Our opinion on the basic financial statements is not affected by this missing information.

Other Information

Our audit was conducted for the purpose of forming opinions on the financial statements that collectively comprise the Authority's basic financial statements. The combining financial statements and supplementary information listed in the table of contents is presented for purposes of additional analysis and is not a required part of the financial statements. Such information is the responsibility of management and was derived from and relates directly to the underlying accounting and other records used to prepare the financial statements. The information has been subjected to the auditing procedures applied in the audit of the financial statements and certain additional procedures, including comparing and reconciling such information directly to the underlying accounting and other records used to prepare the financial statements or to the financial statements themselves, and other additional procedures in accordance with auditing standards generally accepted in the United States of America. In our opinion, the combining financial statements and supplementary information is fairly stated in all material respects in relation to the financial statements as a whole.

NOTES TO THE FINANCIAL STATEMENTS

December 31, 2016

NOTE 1: **SUMMARY OF SIGNIFICANT ACCOUNTING POLICIES**

The financial statements of the Housing Authority of the Town of Windsor (the “Authority”) have been prepared in conformity with generally accepted accounting principles (GAAP) as applied to governmental units. The Governmental Accounting Standards Board (GASB) is the accepted standard-setting body for establishing governmental accounting and financial reporting principles. The more significant of the Authority’s policies are described below.

Reporting Entity

The financial reporting entity consists of the Authority and organizations for which the Authority is financially accountable. All funds, organizations, institutions, agencies, departments and offices that are not legally separate are part of the Authority. In addition, any legally separate organizations for which the Authority is financially accountable are considered part of the reporting entity. Financial accountability exists if the Authority appoints a voting majority of the organization’s governing board and is able to impose its will on the organization, or if the organization provides benefits to, or imposes financial burdens on the Authority.

Based upon the application of these criteria, the Authority does not include additional organizations within its reporting entity.

Measurement Focus, Basis of Accounting, and Financial Statement Presentation

The Authority uses funds to report on its financial position and activities. Fund accounting is designed to segregate transactions related to certain government functions and activities. All of the Authority’s funds are classified as enterprise fund types. Enterprise funds are used to accounts for operations that are financed and operated in a manner similar to private business enterprises, where the intent of the governing body is that the costs of providing goods or services to the general public on a continuing basis be financed or recovered primarily through user charges. Major individual funds are reported as separate columns in the financial statements.

The financial statements are reported using the economic resources measurement focus and the accrual basis of accounting. Revenues are recorded when earned and expenses are recorded when a liability is incurred, regardless of the timing of related cash flows. Grants and similar items are recognized as revenue as soon as all eligibility requirements imposed by the provider have been met.

Measurement Focus, Basis of Accounting, and Financial Statement Presentation
(Continued)

Enterprise funds distinguish operating revenues and expenses from nonoperating items. Operating revenues and expenses generally result from providing services and producing and delivering goods in connection with a proprietary fund's principal ongoing operations. Operating expenses for enterprise funds include the cost of sales and services, administrative expenses, and depreciation on capital assets. All revenues and expenses not meeting this definition are reported as nonoperating revenues and expenses.

When both restricted and unrestricted resources are available for use, it is the Authority's policy to use restricted resources first and the unrestricted resources as they are needed.

The Authority reports all financial activity in one proprietary fund.

Assets, Liabilities and Fund Balance/Net Position

Cash and Investments – Cash and cash equivalents include amounts in deposit accounts and short-term investments with an original maturity of three months or less. Investments are recorded at fair value.

Receivables – Receivables are expensed as bad debts at the time they are determined to be uncollectible.

Capital Assets – The Authority capitalizes all assets estimated useful life in excess of one year. Such assets are recorded at historical cost or estimated historical cost if purchased or constructed. Donated capital assets are recorded at estimated fair market value at the date of donation. Interest is capitalized during the construction phase.

Depreciation of exhaustible capital assets is charged as an expense against operations, and accumulated depreciation is reported on the statement of net position in the financial statements. Depreciation has been provided over the following estimated useful lives of the capital assets using the straight-line method: buildings and improvements, 50 years; equipment, 10 years.

Assets, Liabilities and Fund Balance/Net Position (Continued)

Net Position – Net position are restricted when constraints placed on the net position are externally imposed.

Compensated Absences

Employees of the Authority earned Paid Time Off (PTO). An employee may accrue a maximum of two years' worth of PTO, depending on the employee's the length of service. Once an employee reaches the maximum amount, no additional PTO is accrued. These compensated absences are recognized as a liability when earned.

Risk Management

The Authority is exposed to various risks of loss related to torts; theft of, damage to, and destruction of assets; injuries to employees; and natural disasters. The Authority purchases commercial insurance for these risks of loss. Settled claims have not exceeded insured amounts for the last three years.

Comparative Data

Comparative total data for the prior year has been presented in the accompanying financial statements in order to provide an understanding of changes in the District's financial position and operations. However, complete comparative data in accordance with generally accepted accounting principles has not been presented since its inclusion would make the financial statements unduly complex and difficult to read. Data in these columns do not present financial position or results of operations in conformity with generally accepted accounting principles. Neither is such data comparable to a consolidation. Interfund eliminations have not been made in the aggregation of this data.

Subsequent Events

The management of the Authority has performed an evaluation of subsequent events through March 21, 2017, and has considered any relevant matters in the preparation of the financial statements.

NOTE 2: STEWARDSHIP, COMPLIANCE AND ACCOUNTABILITY

Budgetary Information

A budget is adopted for the proprietary fund as a management control device, but is not legally required. Therefore, budgetary information is not presented in the financial statements.

NOTE 3: CASH AND INVESTMENTS

Deposits

Custodial Credit Risk – Deposits

Custodial credit risk is the risk that in the event of a bank failure, the government's deposits may not be returned to it. The Colorado Public Deposit Protection Act (PDPA) requires that all units of local government deposit cash in eligible public depositories. Eligibility is determined by state regulations. At December 31, 2016, State regulatory commissioners have indicated that all financial institutions holding deposits for the Authority are eligible public depositories. Amounts on deposit in excess of federal insurance levels must be collateralized by eligible collateral as determined by the PDPA. PDPA allows the financial institution to create a single collateral pool for all public funds held.

The pool is to be maintained by another institution, or held in trust for all the uninsured public deposits as a group. The market value of the collateral must be at least equal to 102% of the uninsured deposits. The Authority has no policy regarding custodial credit risk for deposits.

At December 31, 2016, the Authority had deposits with financial institutions with a carrying amount of \$1,233,891. The bank balances with the financial institutions were \$1,233,726. Of these balances, \$600,036 was covered by federal depository insurance and \$633,690 was covered by collateral held by authorized escrow agents in the financial institution's name (PDPA).

Investments

Interest Rate Risk

The Authority does not have a formal investment policy that limits investment maturities as a means of managing its exposure to fair value losses arising from increasing interest rates.

NOTE 3: CASH AND INVESTMENTS

Credit Risk

Colorado statutes specify in which instruments units of local government may invest, which include:

- Obligations of the United States and certain U.S. Government Agency securities
- General obligation and revenue bonds of U.S. local government entities
- Bankers' acceptances of certain banks
- Local government investment pools
- Written repurchase agreements collateralized by certain authorized securities
- Certain money market funds
- Guaranteed investment contracts

The Authority did not have any investments requiring categorization of credit risk as of December 31, 2016 and had no policy for managing credit risk.

Note Payable – Phase 1. The Authority entered into a loan agreement with the United States Department of Agriculture to provide financing for the Century III apartment complex. The note requires monthly principal and interest payments of \$909. The note carries an interest rate of 9% per year, 1% of which is subsidized by the United States Department of Agriculture. The loan matures in January 2027.

Note Payable – Phase 2. The Authority entered into a loan agreement with the United States Department of Agriculture to provide financing for the Century III apartment complex. The note requires monthly principal and interest payments of \$2,587. The note carries an interest rate of 8.5% per year, 1% of which is subsidized by the United States Department of Agriculture. The loan matures in May 2029.

Note Payable – Improvements. The Authority entered into a loan agreement with the United States Department of Agriculture to provide financing for improvements of the Century III apartment complex. The note requires monthly principal and interest payments of \$318. The note carries an interest rate of 5.375%, 1% of which is subsidized by the United States Department of Agriculture. The loan matures in May 2058.

NOTE 7: RETIREMENT PLAN

The Authority has established a pre-tax Simplified Employee Pension Plan (SEP) for eligible employees. The current funding rate is 12.4% of salary. For the years ended December 31, 2016 and 2015, the Authority's contributions to the plan were \$3,902 and \$4,465 respectively, equal to their required contributions for each year.

NOTE 8: COMMITMENTS AND CONTINGENCIES

Management Agreement

The Authority has entered into a management agreement with the Housing Authority of the City of Loveland (HACOL) for contracted services. Under the terms of this agreement, the Authority contracts for management and accounting services. The contracted services have been classified as functional expenses for better reporting purposes.

Claims and Judgments

The Authority participates in a number of federal programs that are fully or partially funded by grants received from other governmental units. Expenditures financed by grants are subject to audit by the appropriate grantor government. If expenditures are disallowed due to noncompliance with grant program regulations, the Authority may be required to reimburse the grantor government. As of December 31, 2016, significant amounts of grant expenditures have not been audited, but the Authority believes that disallowed expenditures, if any, based on subsequent audits will not have a material effect on the overall financial position of the Authority.

Tabor Amendment

In November 1992, Colorado voters passed the Tabor Amendment to the State Constitution, which limits state and local government tax powers and imposes spending limitations. Fiscal year 1993 provides the basis for limits in future years to which may be applied allowable increases for inflation and student enrollment. Revenue received in excess of the limitations may be required to be refunded. The Tabor Amendment is subject to many interpretations, but the Authority believes it is exempt from the provisions of the amendment.

NOTE 9: *DEVELOPMENT PROJECTS*

The Authority is a partner in a development project that provides low income housing in the Windsor area. The Authority has obtained financing and grants for a portion of the costs of this project and will loan these funds to Windsor Meadows Apartments II, LLLP.

The Housing Authority of the City of Loveland has signed development agreements with these entities to assist in obtaining financing, coordinating the projects, supervising the construction, and providing accounting and other administrative services.
