#### Policy - Requirements

The Office of the State Auditor Local Government Audit Division may accept an electronic submission of an application for exemption from audit that includes governing board signatures obtained through a program such as DocuSign or Echosign. Required elements and safeguards are as follows:

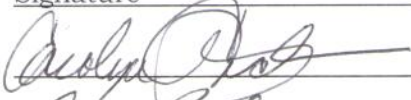


WHEREAS, neither revenues nor expenditures for **Town of Iliff** exceeded \$750,000 for Year 2020; and
