Filtered Discussion Guide

- 1) What statements/points stood out to you?
 - a) Examples:
 - i) The HG is a built in filter, that protects us from impurities on this earth
 - ii) In order to put something in our lives, we have to take something out (filters replace sin/shortcomings)
- 2) 1 John 3:3 And every man that hath this hope in him purifieth himself, even as he is pure.
 - a) What purifies us?
 - i) The HOPE, which is, the hope of salvation through the Holy Ghost in that we will be like Jesus when he appears again.
 - b) Why is it important to live a pure life?
 - i) We cannot be like Jesus without being pure
 - ii) 1 John 3:3 says that Jesus is pure, so we need to be pure
- 3) Pastor mentioned in his sermon that people who have only had access to dirty water, celebrate over being able to obtain clean water. How does this translate to the spiritual?
 - a) As sinners, we have been partakers of the "dirty water", that is immorality and sin. When we are exposed to the gospel and follow the steps to salvation (Acts 2:38), we obtain "clean water", that is the Holy Ghost. It is worth a celebration!
 - b) Read these scripture together:
 - i) Psalms 34:8 O taste and see that the Lord is good: blessed is the man that trusteth in him.

- ii) John 4:13-14 **13** Jesus answered and said unto her, Whosoever drinketh of this water shall thirst again: **14** But whosoever drinketh of the water that I shall give him shall never thirst; but the water that I shall give him shall be in him a well of water springing up into everlasting life.
- John 7:37-39 **37** In the last day, that great day of the feast, Jesus stood and cried, saying, If any man thirst, let him come unto me, and drink. **38** He that believeth on me, as the scripture hath said, out of his belly shall flow rivers of living water. **39** (But this spake he of the Spirit, which they that believe on him should receive: for the Holy Ghost was not yet given; because that Jesus was not yet glorified.)
- 4) According to Pastor's childhood story, why do we teeter the line of godliness vs. ungodliness?
 - a) Lack of maturity and proper filters
 - b) When we apply the Holy Ghost and other biblical filters, we are able to live a godly lifestyle, however, we will NEVER be perfect.
- 5) What has God called us to in 2 Peter 1:3?
 - a) Glory and Virtue
- 6) What allows us to experience God's divine nature?
 - a) The exceeding great and precious promises that He has given us
- 7) How do His promises allow us to experience His nature?
 - a) If we trust in Him, His promises reveal how powerful and mighty He truly is, as well as pieces of his personality.

- b) Also, when we follow Jesus, we escape the corruption that is in the world.
- 8) 2 Peter 1:5-7 talk about the filters we need to put into our life. What are they? (Teacher side note: be sure to talk about what all of these really mean, see parentheses, as well as, how we apply them)
 - a) Faith
 - b) Virtue (modest living)
 - c) Knowledge
 - d) Temperance (self control)
 - e) Patience
 - f) Godliness
 - g) Brotherly Kindness
 - h) Charity (Love)
- 9) Do these filters need to be applied in order? If so, why?
 - a) A new believer cannot be expected to live a godly lifestyle if: he/she doesn't believe (faith), if they do not understand modesty (virtue), if they do not know who God is, etc.
 - b) They definitely have to be in order.
- 10) In order to put a filter in place, what must we do?
 - a) Replace it with something.
 - b) Replace: doubt with **faith**, immorality with **virtue**, ignorance with **knowledge**, lust with **temperance**, impatience with **patience**, ungodliness with **godliness**, selfishness with **brotherly kindness**, and hate with **love**
