

YOUR NEXT STEPS

From your diocesan team and Many Parts Ministries

You just spent time hearing that God has given you gifts — charisms — meant for the good of the people around you. If you took the charism assessment, you're now looking at a short list of your most likely charisms, and the question is what to do with it. Here's where to go from here. Pick one thing — you don't need to do all of it this week.

IF YOU TOOK THE CHARISM ASSESSMENT

Read the second half of your report. The first half shows your most likely charisms. The second half shows you more about the gifts themselves, discernment, and next steps you can take. A lot of people skip this section, but it's well worth the time.

Test your most likely gifts. Pick the charisms that felt most true today and find small ways to use each of them in the next few weeks — a meal, a conversation, an hour of serving. That's how discernment works: you name a charism so you can value it and invest in it, and small tests are how to learn where you see the best return on your investment.

FOR YOUR PARISH

Ask what's already included. Your parish has access to charism resources through your diocese — studies, trainings, and assessment tools that are already paid for and ready to use. Your parish office or diocesan team can tell you exactly what's there.

Start a small-group study. The studies included in your diocese's program are made for exactly the group of people who got excited today. Gather three or four of them and pick a start date.

Invite the team back. One event opens the door; discernment keeps going after it. Your diocesan team can come back for your staff, a ministry team, or your youth group — ask a team member today, or reach out through your diocesan offices.
