



Abandoned Vehicles

Pursuant to I.C. 9-22 of the Indiana State Statute and the City of Marion Abandoned Vehicle and Parking Violation Ordinance 1-2021:

- All vehicles must be insured, registered, and have current plates physically on the vehicle, when it is parked on public AND private property
- Vehicles may not be parked on public property for more than seventy two (72) hours at a time. Vehicles must be moved at least every seventy two (72) hours; even if it is parked directly in front of the owner's residence.
- All vehicles must be parked on an approved surface, i.e.: gravel, asphalt, or concrete. Vehicles may not be parked in your yard.
- If a vehicle is tagged by Code Enforcement on private OR public property, the owner has three (3) days to correct the violation
- If a vehicle has flat tires it is considered inoperable and in violation
- If a vehicle does not have proper plates and/or a current sticker physically on the vehicle, it is considered in violation by City of Marion Code Enforcement.
- If your vehicle is tagged by Code Enforcement for improper/expired plates on the vehicle, and you believe this is incorrect, please contact Code Enforcement as soon as possible with proof. If you wait until the vehicle is towed to provide proof you will be responsible to pay the fees to retrieve your vehicle.

Fees:

Tag/violation fee:	\$50.00 (fee is only imposed if the vehicle is towed)
Tow fee:	\$80.00
Administrative fee:	\$100.00
Storage fee:	\$20.00 per day (fee begins the next day after the vehicle is towed)

To reclaim your vehicle you must provide:

- Proof of ownership
- Current registration
- If the vehicle is inoperable, you must provide verification from a mechanic or repair shop, showing that they will be repairing the vehicle
