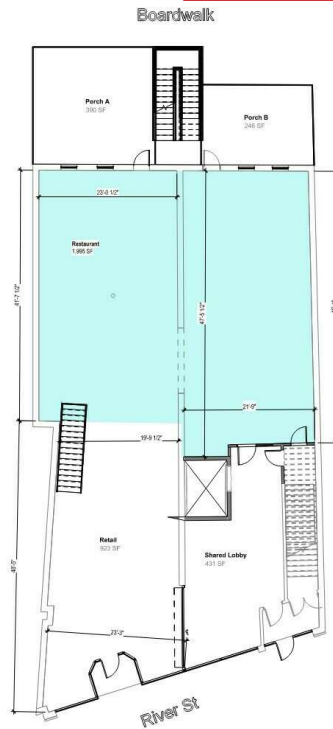

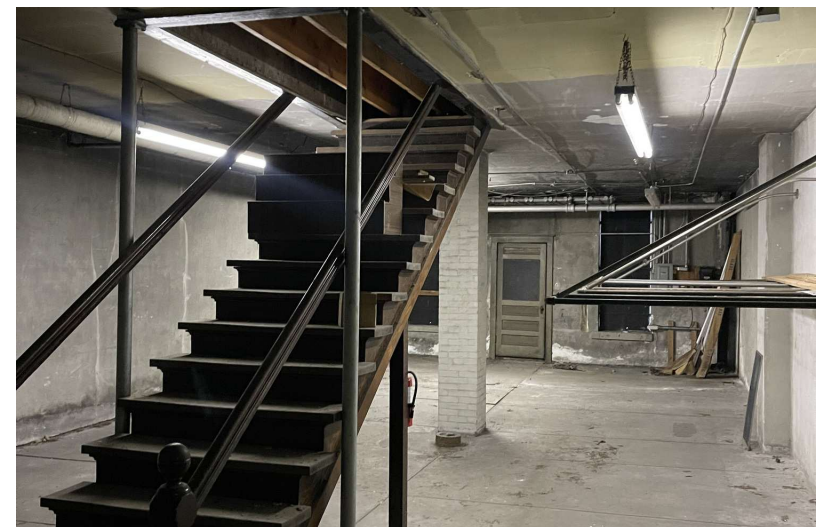
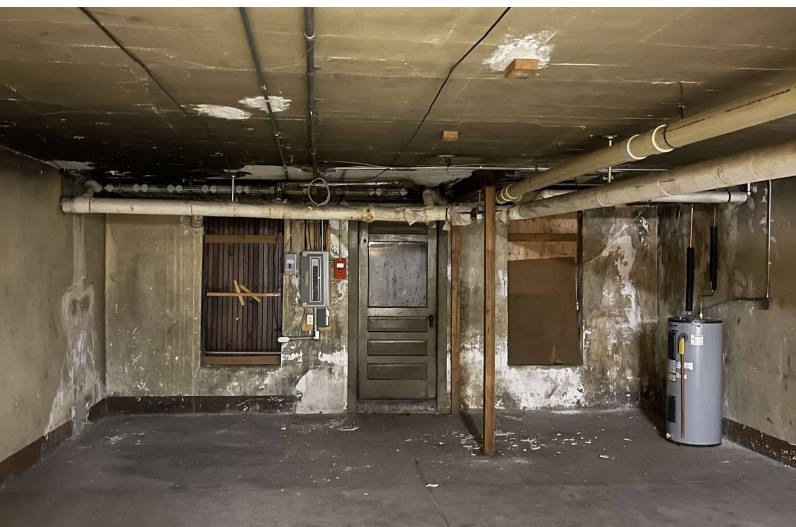
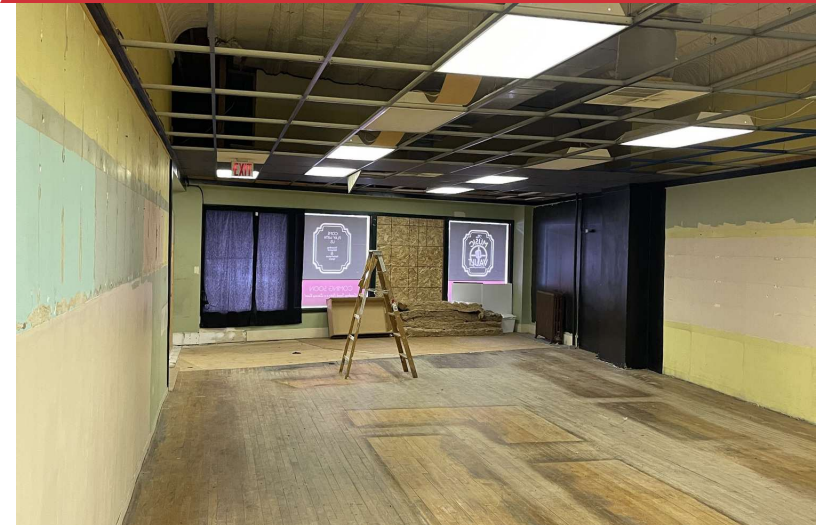


3 SECOND FLOOR PLAN

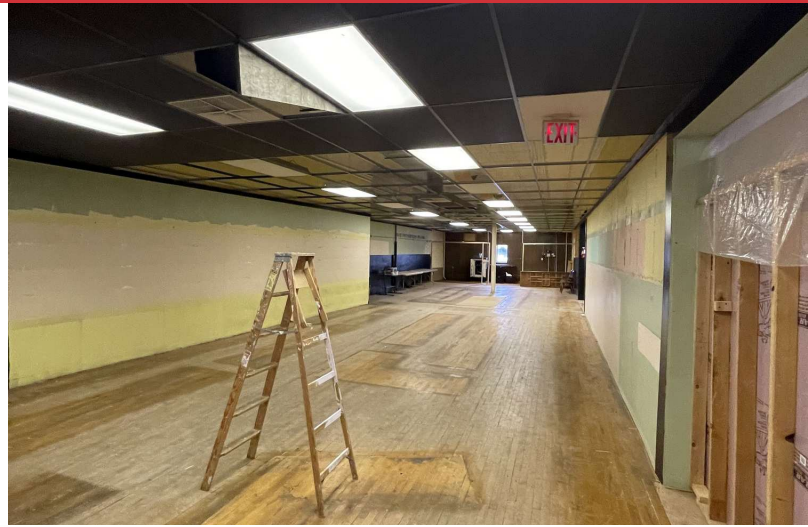

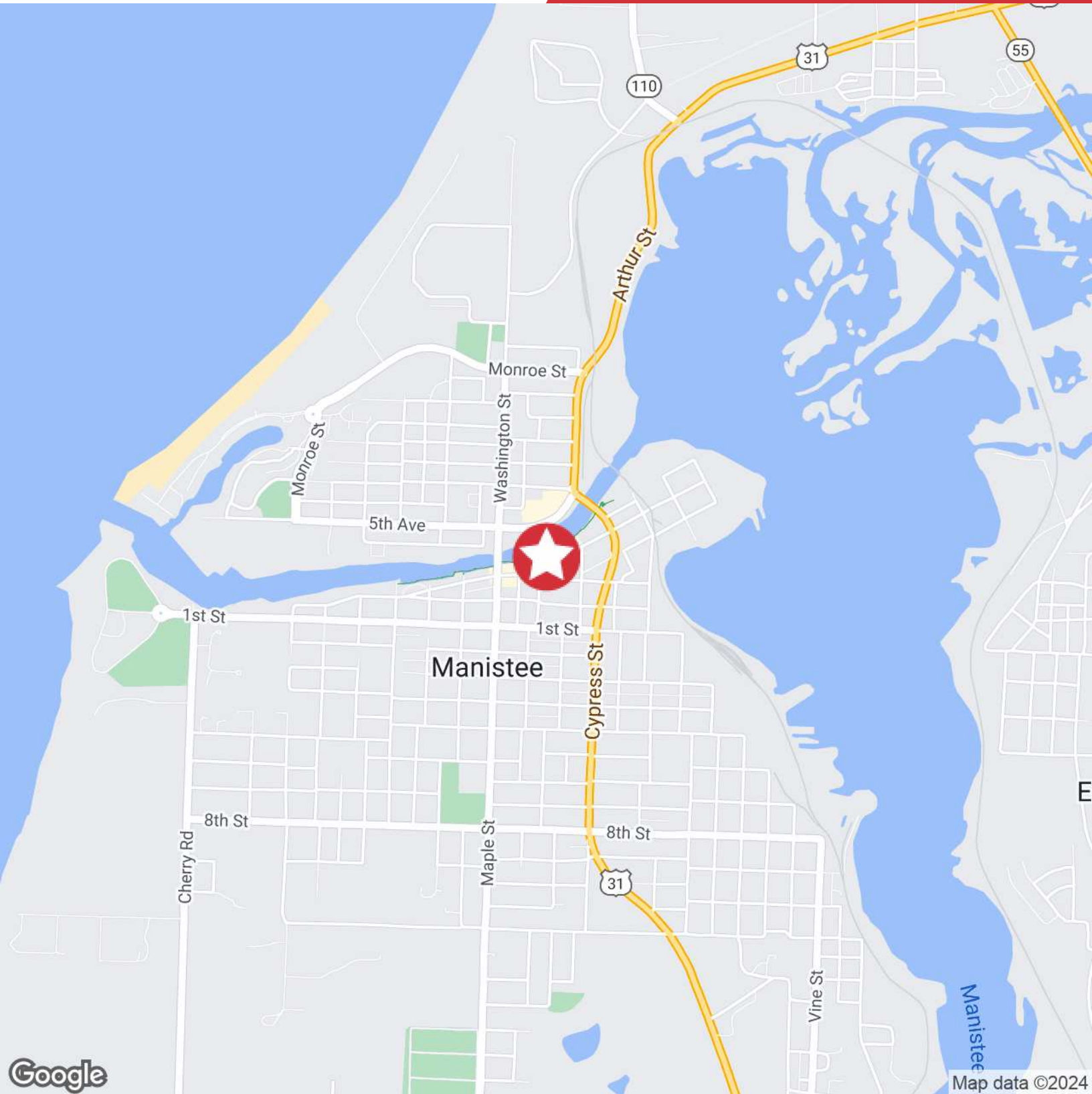

348 River Street

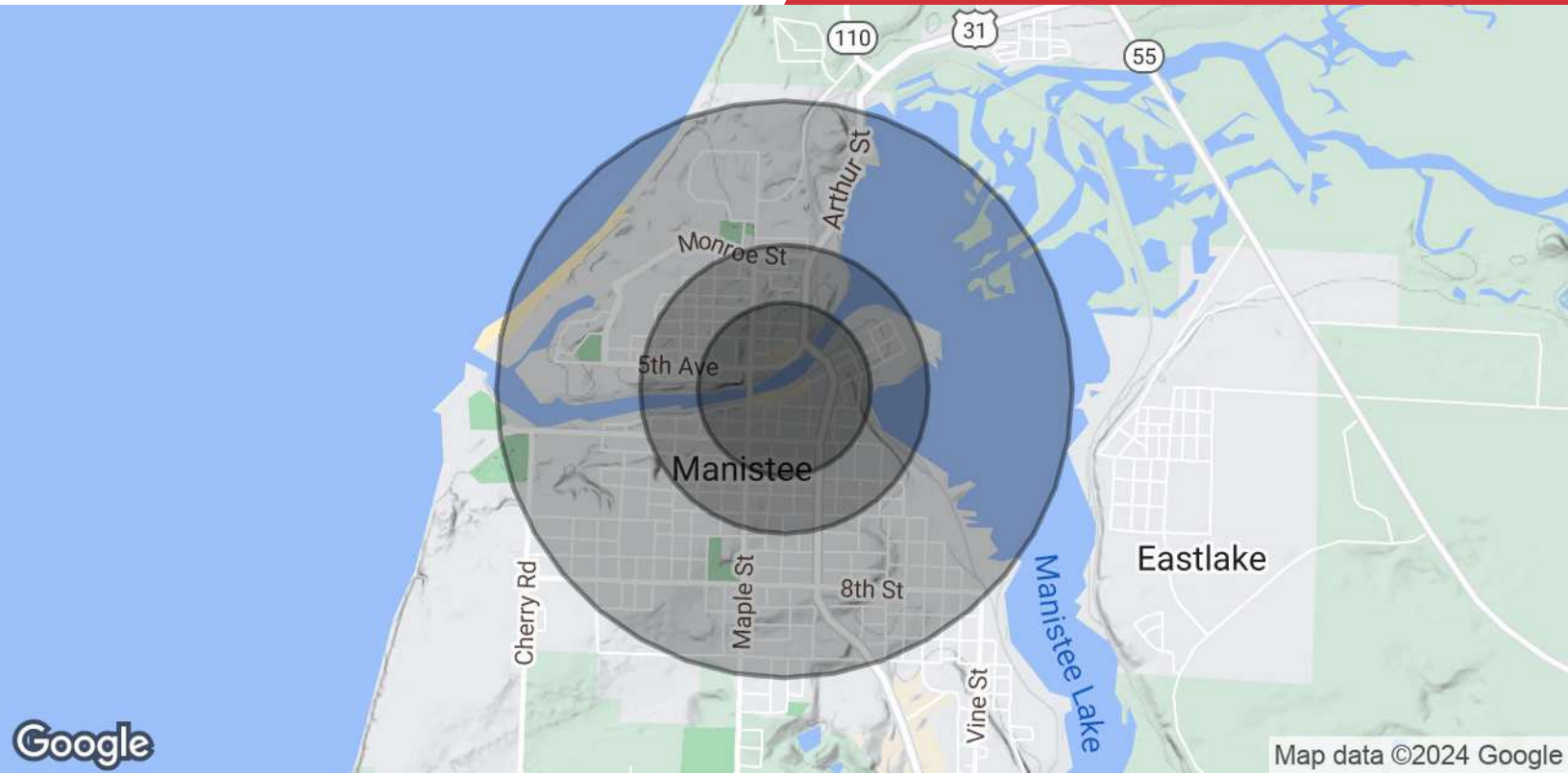
