Treat younger men as brothers, older women as mothers, and younger women as sisters, with absolute purity... I charge you, in the sight of God and Christ Jesus and the elect angels, to keep these instructions without partiality, and to do nothing out of favoritism. (1 Tim 5:1-2, 21).

A) Perhaps the most overlooked sin among Christian singles

(James 2:1, 8-9).

"Make up your mind not to put any stumbling block . . . in your brother's way" (Rom 14:13).

B) Living in a "family" of Christians

"Flee the evil desires of youth, and pursue righteousness, faith, love and peace, along with those who call on the Lord out of a pure heart" (2 Tim 2:22).
