Chapter 5: How the Pastor Cares for His People (Part 1)

- 1. -A pastor's leadership must be authoritative—not authoritarian.
 - -Based on trust and respect that is earned (1 Tim. 3:1-7)
 - -Using gentle appeals versus harsh rebukes (vv. 1-2)
 - -Views the church as a family
 - -Older men as fathers, younger men as brothers
 - -Older women as mothers, younger women as sisters—with absolute purity (2 Tim. 3:6)
- 2. -A pastor ensures care ministry occurs to meet genuine needs in the church.
 - -Care begins in the family unit (vv. 4,7,16)
 - -Children and grandchildren owe a debt of caring to parents and grandparents (who cared for them when they were young)
 - -Those who neglect immediate family and relatives:
 - "denied the -faith...worse than an unbeliever"
 - -This enables the church to care for those who have no one else to care for them
 - -The church cares for those (widows) who are really in need
 - -Based on need but not indiscriminate (qualifications listed in vv. 9-10)
 - -The "list of widows" and care ministry likely overseen by the deacons (Acts 6:1-7)
 - -Younger widows are encouraged to remarry, have children, and manage their homes well
- 3. -A pastor who leads well deserves honor in the form of appropriate financial compensation.
 - -In the same manner that Christians are expected to provide for their own families, the church has a responsibility to give at a level that provides the pastor a salary commensurate with his performance
 - -A pastor who leads well and/or has a speaking ministry deserves greater honor in the form of higher compensation (vv. 17-18)
 - -As a church grows in size, the need for better leadership grows exponentially
 - -Informality replaced with formal processes
 - -Administrative load increases
 - -More difficult decisions on how to use resources (giving doesn't always increase at the same rate as attendance)
 - -To ensure adequate care, pastors must transition from personal care-giving to developing and equipping more lay leadership
