## The Essentials of Your Christian Identity

#1: Christ's Love Compels Us
2 Corinthians 5:14

Faith in the sacrificial and unconditional love of Christ forcefully compels and drives us to live for Christ (2 Corinthians 5:14a).

How much you love and obey God depends on how much you believe He loves you.

## 1) You cannot love God more than you believe He loves you

Often Pastors and parents try to convince people more about the <u>commands</u> of God instead of the <u>love</u> of God. Often they put <u>more pressure</u> on people to obey instead of helping them have <u>more power</u> to obey. Many parents and Pastors should preach less commands and pray more love. (Eph 3:18-19)

## 2) Growing in your faith

The strength of your faith is always based on evidence. (Heb 11:1; Matt 6:26; Rom 5:8).

Since the cross of Christ, it is no longer God's love for you that is on trial, but your love for God. (Jam 1:17; 1 Sam 17:34-37; Ps 78:9-11)
