Spiritual Freedom #3: Satan's Sifting Luke 22:31-32

"Simon, Simon, Satan has asked to sift each of you like wheat. But I have pleaded in prayer for you, Simon, that your faith should not fail. So when you have repented and turned to me again, strengthen your brothers." (Luke 22:31-32 NLT)

Primary point: God uses Satan to refine our lives so we become better servants of Christ.

A) God uses Satan to humble us (Luke 22:33-62)

B) God uses Satan to humble us in our strengths (John 18:2-3, 10, 26-27)

C) God uses Satan to humble us in order to use us in greater ways

(John 21:15-17)
