Real Christianity: The Sermon on the Mount

#1: How should we preach the word?

Matthew 5:1

One day as he saw the crowds gathering, Jesus went up on the mountainside and sat down. His disciples gathered around him, and he began to teach them. (Matt 5:1 NLT)

Primary point: Jesus taught topically, practically, and with repetition.

A) Topical vs. verse by verse teaching

There are many doctrines in Scripture that will not be very well understood with verse by verse teaching. (e.g. Luke 24:27)

B) Practical truth vs. Bible trivia

Be careful of the claim that Bible knowledge and Bible studies is the key to spiritual power.

Why were the Christians of the first three hundred years of the Church so powerful, godly, and fruitful even though virtually none of them possessed a NT?

"Knowledge puffs up, but love builds up" (1 Cor 8:1 NIV).

C) Repetition vs. novelty

Why did Jesus and the Apostles repeat themselves so often? (2 Pet 1:12).

Don't claim to fully understand something until you can clearly and accurately teach it.
