

MEADOWLANDS PARKS AND FACILITIES:

Additional information on each park is available on our website. All fishing in the Meadowlands is catch and release only.

Richard W. DeKorte Park, Lyndhurst

Nature trails, panoramic views, birds galore, observatory. Trail guides available. 3.5 miles of trails. Open daily 8 am to dusk.



Note: No dog walking, biking or fishing on Marsh Discovery Trail.

River Barge Park and Marina, Carlstadt

Urban jewel located on the Hackensack River. Docks and boat ramp for kayaks, canoes, small boats and other watercraft. Slips for rent. Promenade with picnic tables overlooking the river. NJSEA Pontoon Boat tours departure site. Visit our website to register for a tour. Open daily 8 am to dusk.



Mill Creek Point Park and Boat Launch, Secaucus

River views, benches, launch ramp for paddlers and small watercraft. Elevated boardwalk over wetlands. Small playground. 3-acres.



Mill Creek Marsh, Secaucus

Walking trail, prime spot for birdwatching, popular for paddlers. Low tide reveals dozens of ancient White Cedar stumps. 206-acres of wetlands.



Losen Slote Creek Park, Little Ferry

One of the few remaining woodlands in the Meadowlands District. 6-acres of meadows and 22-acres of lowland forest.



Laurel Hill County Park and Boat Launch, Secaucus

Ball fields, playgrounds, boat ramp, great views of the Hackensack River and Saw Mill Creek Wildlife Management Area. Framed by 200-foot high Laurel Hill. 70-acres. Open daily 8 am to dusk.

ABOUT THE NJSEA: The New Jersey Sports and Exposition Authority is the planning and zoning agency for the 30.4-square-mile Meadowlands District, comprised of parts of 14 municipalities in Bergen and Hudson counties. In February 2015, the former New Jersey Meadowlands Commission (NJMC) was consolidated into the NJSEA.

Created in 1969, the NJMC (now NJSEA) has fought to end illegal dumping and encourage appropriate development in the Meadowlands District, and has helped to protect thousands of acres of wetlands and open space. The agency has also developed or contributed to the design of 21 parks throughout the Meadowlands.

Join twice monthly nature walks led by the Bergen County Audubon Society at beautiful natural areas like DeKorte Park in Lyndhurst, Mill Creek Marsh and Laurel Hill Park in Secaucus, and Losen Slote Creek Park in Little Ferry.



More than 280 species of birds have been seen in the Meadowlands region, including egrets, raptors and rare species considered endangered or threatened.



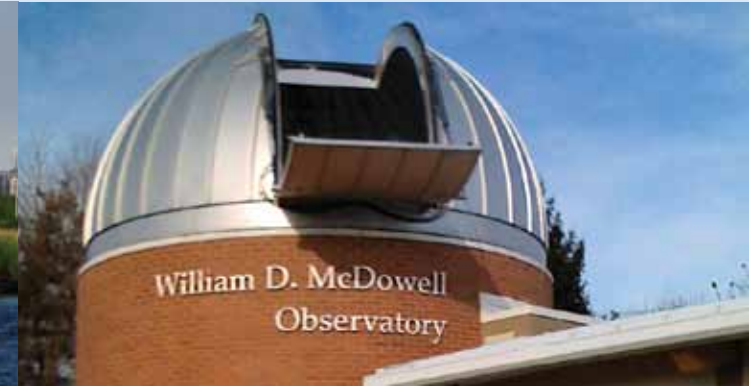
Experience the Environmental Renaissance
