STATE V. DARRYL WALLACE

On July 7, 2025, Darryl Wallace, age 34 of Columbus, Ohio, was sentenced to 60 years in New Jersey State Prison for murder by the Hon. Niki Arbittier, J.S.C. Wallace must serve 85% (51 years) of his sentence without parole pursuant to the No Early Release Act (NERA). Wallace received a concurrent 10 year New Jersey State Prison with a 5 year period of parole ineligibility for Possession of a Weapon (firearm) by a Convicted Person. Wallace's convictions for Possession of a Weapon (firearm) for an Unlawful Purpose and Unlawful Possession of a Weapon (firearm) merged into his murder sentence.

Darryl Wallace was found guilty on October 8 and October 9, 2024 by a Cumberland County Jury of the following offenses:

- 1. Murder, 1st degree;
- 2. Possession of a Firearm for an Unlawful Purpose, 2nd degree;
- 3. Unlawful Possession of a Firearm, 2nd degree; and
- 4. Possession of a Firearm by a Convicted Person, 2nd degree.

The charges arose on June 24, 2021 at the Carlton House Apartment Complex in Millville. When the police arrived, the victim, 28 year old Dominick Hull of Bridgeton, was located lying in the parking lot with a single gunshot wound to his head. The victim was transported to Cooper Hospital, where he died approximately one week later from his injuries. Surveillance footage from the complex showed Darryl Wallace approached the victim and his friends and fired four shots at them from what was determined to be a 9mm firearm. Darryl Wallace was not permitted to possess a firearm due to a prior conviction. Darryl Wallace was subsequently located in Phoenix, Arizona on August 12, 2021 and extradited back to New Jersey on September 1, 2021.
