Artist Statement

500 Yards

In the world of landscape and nature photography, it’s not always about seeking out new places, but seeing with new eyes. Looking for the extraordinary in the ordinary. Living in Northeast Illinois, we have an embarrassment of riches in natural beauty. Lake Michigan, the wonderful county forest preserve systems, The Chicago Botanic Garden, The Morton Arboretum, Cantigny, farm land, forest. The list is endless of places we can photograph in our own backyard.

We can photograph these places to see what they look like captured by the camera. We can photograph these places to remember our experience in the moment that we created that image. We can photograph these places as way to share our creative energy. We can photograph these places to share with others the joy they’ve inspired in us in the hope that we will all be called to be conservationists of nature and the world around us.

All of these images were created within a few minutes of my home in Lake County. Some were created a bit farther away, but all were created essentially in my Chicago-area “backyard.” For these images, I chose black and white printing to encourage you to pause, think, and more closely examine and study their shapes, forms, textures and lighting. Color in photographs is often so distracting that we don’t see essence of the composition. Black and white photography can bring us closer to the essence of the image and hopefully closer to subject.

Artist Bio

Paul Lucas is a Nature and Landscape photographer living in Lake County, IL. The image, Moonrise, Hernandez, New Mexico by Ansel Adams inspired Paul to learn nature photography. He has studied with master photographers Will Clay, Allen Rokach, and Doug Beasely.
