

2019 Mileage Rates Announced by the Internal Revenue Service

The Internal Revenue Service has issued the 2019 optional standard mileage rates used to calculate the deductible costs of operating an automobile for business, charitable, medical or moving purposes.

Beginning on Jan. 1, 2019, the standard mileage rates for the use of a car (also vans, pickups or panel trucks) will be:

- 58 cents per mile driven for business use, up 3.5 cents from the rate for 2018,
- 20 cents per mile driven for medical or moving purposes, up 2 cents from the rate for 2018, and
- 14 cents per mile driven in service of charitable organizations.

The business mileage rate increased 3.5 cents for business travel driven and 2 cents for medical and certain moving expense from the rates for 2018. The charitable rate is set by statute and remains unchanged. Thank you for providing this information to church treasurers as they calculate the 2019 reimbursement rates for mileage driven on church business.

Giving figures have been finalized for 2018. And you all did a great job of supporting ministry in your local communities as well as being supportive of your connections at presbytery and beyond! Outstanding! A total of 99.1% of total per capita income was received. 56 out of 58 congregations were able to fulfill a 100% pay up for Presbytery, Synod and General Assembly! Thank you! ***In Memory:**

- Rev. Charles Harvey McClung, Jr, father of Rev. Charles Harvey McClung III, New Hope Church, died in early December. He was 96. He and his wife had been married for 72 years. A minister member of Philadelphia Presbytery, he had served churches in Pennsylvania and New York. In addition he earned a PhD in Religious Education which led him to teach Christian Education at Beaver College, now Arcadia University. Services to honor the life of Rev. McClung, Jr. were held on December 12 at Rydal Park, Pennsylvania.
- Continue to pray with Rev. Vincent Dagadu, presbytery moderator in the Upper Northern Presbytery, Ghana, and partner with Lake Erie Presbytery in sharing Good News. Vincent's mother died in November, 2018. And on December 20 his father died quite unexpectedly while working in the fields. This has been a double burden of sadness. In Ghana, funeral services are often delayed for weeks or months in order to prepare for the large number of people who attend. The funeral for Vincent's mother has been scheduled for February 2019. Over 800 are expected. Vincent's parent were strong faith leaders in their church and community. And as Vincent shared, "they deeply loved one another".
