Primary healthcare includes health education, education on diet, maternal and child healthcare, immunization, accessible treatment and drugs provision. These services are provided by qualified health professionals with the collaboration of the Government of Ghana and the communities in which the facilities exist. An average of thirty five thousand clients receives treatment for various ailments annually from the Church's health facilities, including pregnant women and children.

Chosen International Medical Assistance since 1969, has shipped millions of dollars' worth of new and remanufactured medical equipment to Christian health care facilities in 110 nations. ChosenIMA also coordinates short term medical/non-medical mission trips and provides durable home medical equipment to the local community.

Mr. Richard Love was an active member of Westminster Presbyterian Church. He founded CHOSEN *Christian Hospitals Overseas Secure Equipment Needs* after a trip to Korea visiting medical missionaries in local hospitals. As an AMSCO quality controller, Dick realized that equipment trade-ins and items rendered obsolete at his employer would be priceless in overseas mission hospitals. Although the organization's focus and outreach have expanded to become ChosenIMA, it remains true to Dick's belief that every life encountered should be enriched and transformed with the hope, knowledge, and love of Jesus Christ.

The Presbytery of Lake Erie, PCUSA encompasses 58 congregations spread out over Northwestern Pennsylvania. In 2011, Lake Erie Presbytery joined with a sister Presbytery in Northern Ghana, West Africa. This Upper Northern Presbytery (UNP) of the Evangelical Presbyterian Church, Ghana (EPCG) consists of over 115 congregations. The Lake Erie and UNP Ghana Partnership is relationship based and works together in areas of mission and ministry.

The Evangelical Presbyterian Church Ghana exemplifies a holistic approach to sharing the Good News of Jesus Christ by providing healthcare services especially in rural areas. The E.P. Church Health Clinic in Wapuli was built in 1975 and provides healthcare delivery for many surrounding communities. The Lake Erie and UNP Ghana Partnership supports the E.P. Clinic Wapuli.
