There are over 6,000 separate funds that make up Dartmouth's endowment. 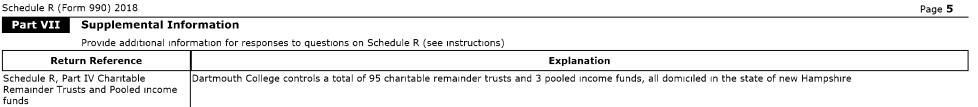
