

Members who register for the annual meeting elect six members of the House of Delegates. ABA members who belong to state and qualifying local Bar Associations also elect delegates, the number being dependent upon the number of ABA members and lawyers in the respective state or local association. Each section has a minimum of two delegates, with additional delegates dependent upon the number of members in each section.
