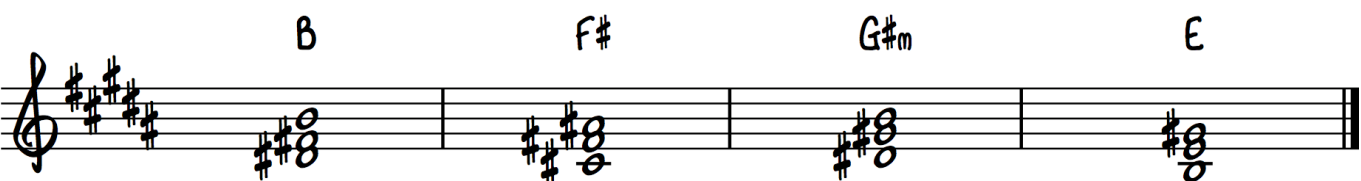
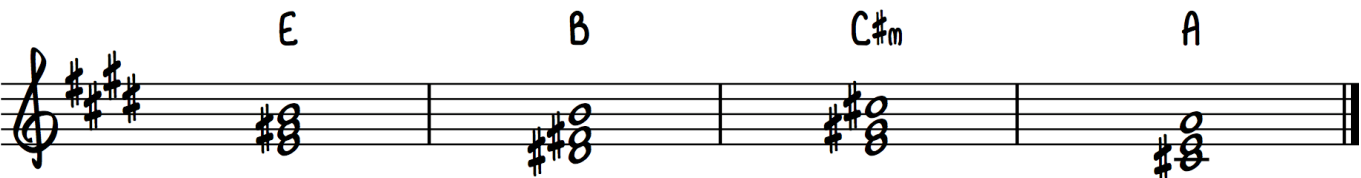
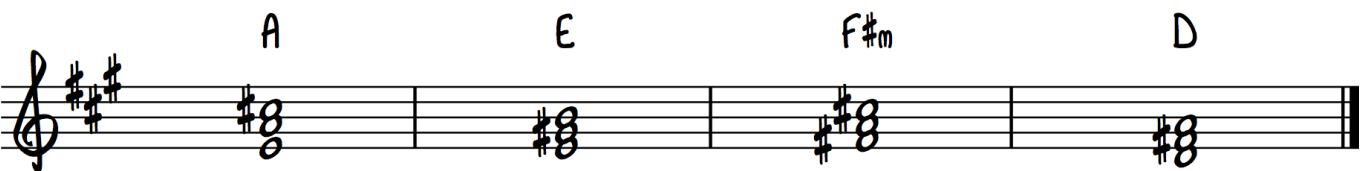
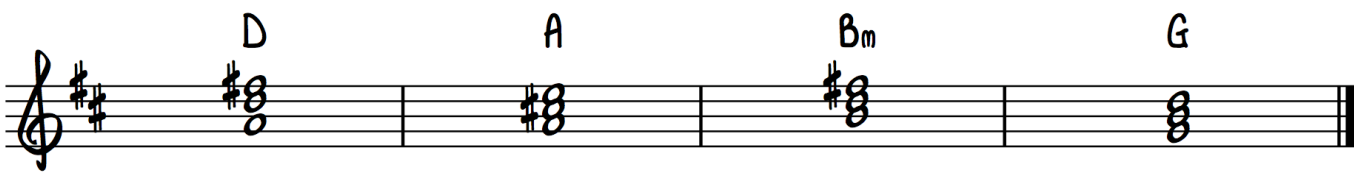
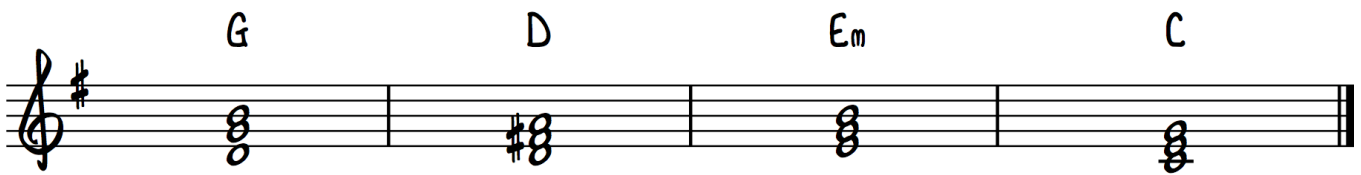
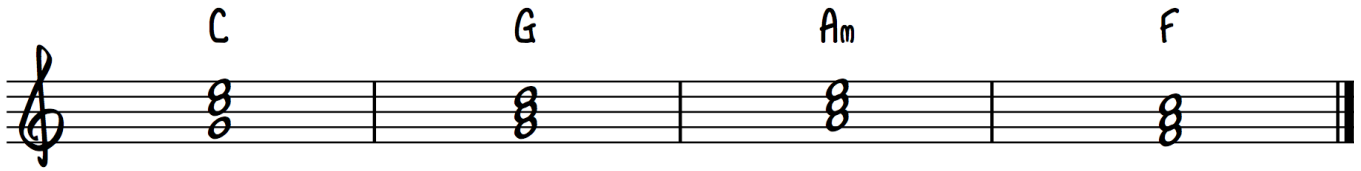


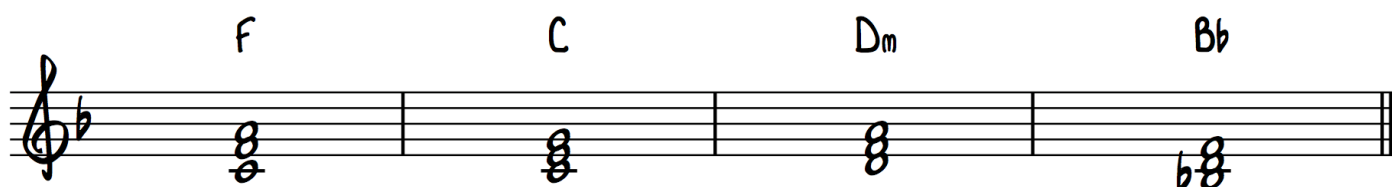
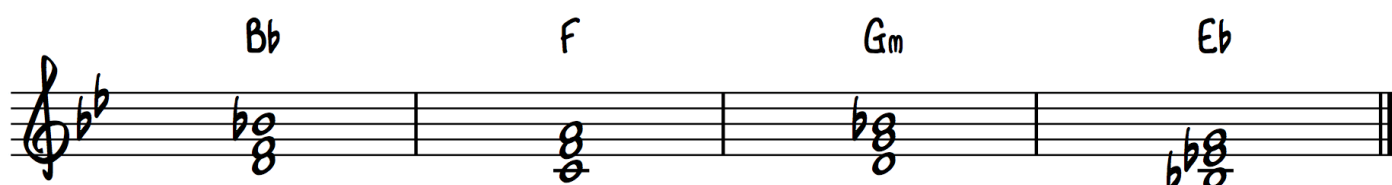
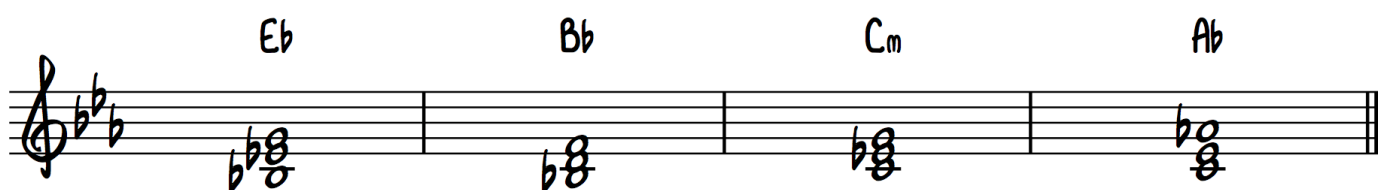
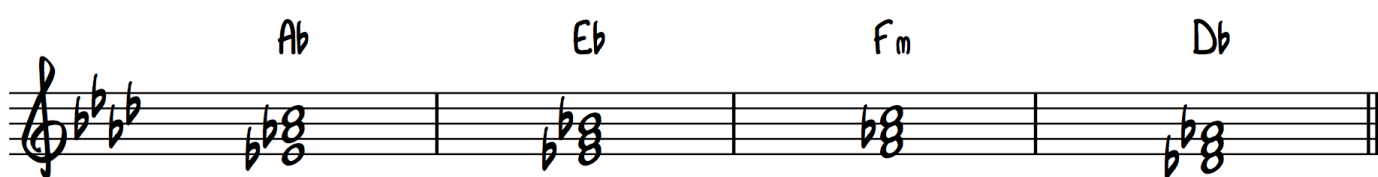
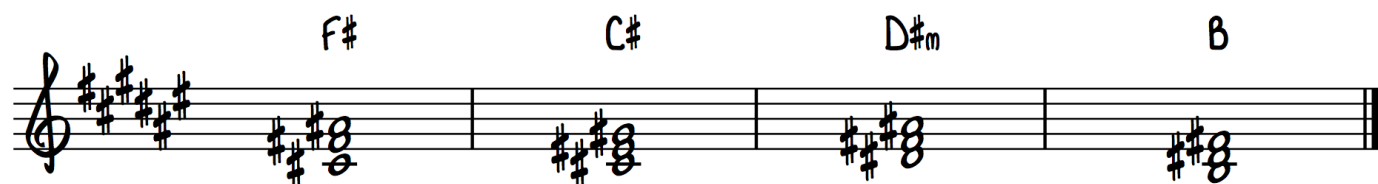
The Four Chords (12 Keys)

These four chords are constructed to create one of the most common chord progressions of all time. It uses chords *I - V - vi - IV*. Once you can play this progression you can essentially play hundreds of songs!





Practice Tips

Pick a key to practice the chord progression in. Go through each chord individually and play all the possible inversions.

Once you are comfortable with all the chords you can begin adding some timing & rhythm to it. Start by playing each chord and count 4 beats for each one. You can then start adding different patterns such as split chords & arpeggios.
