Wheat


The final plant date was extended in all WI counties for winter wheat this year. Please see the map to find your county and the new date. This also extended the late plant period in most counties. Reminder, wheat planted in the late plant period loses 1% of the guarantee per day.

Hav

Enterprise Units are available for hay this year. This may help reduce your premium if you do not want or need optional units.

The deadline is fast approaching for hay and wheat policies. If you want to add these crops or make changes to your current policy, you must do so by **September 30th**.

Both Final Plant Dates (FPD) and the end of the Late Plant Periods (LPP) have changed.







DEFFERAL OF INTEREST FOR 2023

The RMA has waived interest on spring planted crops until December 1st.Premium paid by Nov 30th will not be charged any interest.

This applies to Corn, Soybeans, Oats and Canning Crops.

Forage Seeding and Winter Wheat premium needs to be paid by Sept. 30 as that is the termination date for those policies & if unpaid they will be cancelled!

Spring Seeding is typically on the same bill as your other spring crops, so contact your agent for clarification.

REMINDERS FOR YOUR FALL 2024 POLICIES -DEANNA RANUM

HOW THE POLICIES WORKS:

Wheat

- Yield Protection and Revenue Protection are available.
- Guarantee based on your Actual Production History and August average CBOT price for July wheat.
- Deadline to sign up is September 30th.

Hay (APH)

- Uses your established tonnage history to establish your individual guarantee.
- You must keep records of your production.
- You must contact your agent if you are ripping up any insured acres.
- Deadline to sign up is September 30th.

Hay (AYP)

- Uses a county expected yield and county actual yield to figure losses.
- No records needed.
- Deadline to sign up is September 30th.

Hay (PRF)

- Covers lack of rainfall, regardless of yield.
- No records needed.
- You pick at least two 2-month intervals available throughout the year.
 If there is not normal or below average rainfall in your grid of land in that time frame, the policy pays out.
- You can cover hayed or grazed land.
- Deadline to sign up is December 1st.

To discuss your insurance options on your hay or winter wheat, please contact your agent before the above deadlines.

PLANTING COVER CROPS?

If you are planting a cover crop this fall you must register those acres with DATCP in order to receive the \$5/ acre crop insurance premium credit. The application can be found at: CoverCropRebate.wi.gov The applications will open in December and need to be filed by the end of January.


Cover Crops should also be registered at the FSA by November 15th.

INSURING FALL SEEDING-JENNY KILPATRICK

If you have a forage seeding policy in place and planted a 60%-100% alfalfa seeding mix after July 1, 2023, you may be eligible for coverage on those acres. Depending on your county (see map), the seeding would have had to be planted by 8/20 or 8/31 in most of WI to be insurable. If you have a policy and planted after the final plant date for your county, those forage seeding acres will be uninsurable, no premium will be charged, but you still need to report those acres to your agent. Bottom line, make sure to get your acres recorded with your agent this fall. Insurable fall 2023 seeding is covered until Oct. 15, 2024!

REMINDERS

- Fall 2022 seeding can be appraised now through Oct 15, 2023 for a possible loss
 "If concerned about a loss, talk with your agent to insure a claim is turned in"
- Spring 2023 seeding will be appraised in the spring of 2024



HARVEST CLAIMS & REMINDERS

Every year presents us with new challenges as we go through the growing season. As we approach harvest, there are a number of things we need to keep in mind as it pertains to our Crop Insurance policy:

If you have Revenue Protection, you need to identify your trigger point as this potentially will change from the spring due to price movement. Ex: If your Corn guarantee is 150 bu, your revenue guarantee is \$886 per acre. We will value the harvested bushels at the October CBOT average for Dec Corn which has been trading around \$4.90 of late. If this holds, you will now trigger a loss payment at 180 bu (\$886 / \$4.90). These numbers are specific to each policy based on APH and coverage level, so have that discussion with your agent.

If you are chopping silage, harvesting high moisture corn, or bypassing severely damaged areas, an appraisal of those acres will be needed prior to harvest. We strongly encourage you to take some time to go to the field with the adjuster or at least discuss with them what they found before they leave the farm. This year we have seen a lot of uneven stand issues so it will be harder than normal to assess what is out there.

Do you have any "old crop" in the bin that you will be comingling with "new crop"? If you do, we will need to send an adjuster out to measure the existing production to be able to isolate the 2023 crop after harvest. Call your agent to set that up.

Harvested production needs to be accounted for by unit. If you have "Optional Units" you need to keep track of production by section. If you have "Enterprise Units" keeping track by section or farm is less important but still highly recommended to keep your options open down the road if you chose to change unit structure.

Do you have any "uninsured acres"? Uninsured New Breaking acres, or crop planted after 1st crop hay for example, will need to be kept separate from your insured acres when reporting for history purposes.

It is your duty to report a loss. If you have concern about a possible loss, contact your agent to file a claim ASAP. We would rather submit and release a claim than miss the deadline to file it.

With the drought conditions in some areas this year, it is hard to know what we are going to find this fall until we get in the fields. That being the case, it is more important than ever to know your policy trigger points and communicate with your agent.
