

Essay Writing Steps To Follow

No one can deny the fact that writing an essay is always an exasperating and maddening process, especially when students have to take care of several other things happening in their lives. Actual Steps To Write An Essay

There are several basic steps to writing a convincing essay, and you have to pay attention to all of them to ensure that your essay fetches you top grades.

- 1.**The first step will always involve researching your topic. Unless you make yourself an expert in a particular subject/topic, you will never be able to write convincingly enough.
- 2.**After you have understood the topic, you will have to analyze the arguments and clearly state the reasons and claims.
- 3.**You will also have to spend time in a brainstorming session to find unique and new ideas.
- 4.**The ideas you find in a brainstorming session should go on a paper, so that you could easily select the best ones to use in your essay. Using all your selected ideas, you will have to develop a thesis statement.
- 5.**Once you have developed the statement, the next step is to design an outline of your essay. This is basically a sketch that tells you how you would like to proceed with your essay. Without an outline, you will soon lose track and then interest in writing an essay.
- 6.**After creating the outline, you will have to start writing the very first paragraph of your essay. The introductory paragraph is extremely important. If the first paragraph fails to grab your reader's attention, then the time you have spent in researching will be wasted.
- 7.**Next up, write body paragraphs and explain different points in different paragraphs.
- 8.**The last paragraph will require you to summarize all your points you have highlighted in different paragraphs. Tell your readers how those points are relevant and support your thesis statement.

It is not easy for students to handle all these steps, and even if they try to write on their own, they often fail to develop a right style of writing.
