

In this workshop, Dr. Campbell will present a clear and engaging account of the current understanding of narcissism. He will focus on the two faces of narcissism, grandiose – the energized and aggressive face and vulnerable – the sad and defensive face. The audience will learn how these faces of narcissism have important similarities and differences. Dr. Campbell will then highlight several social consequences of narcissism, from social media to leadership, and how the different aspects of narcissism can play a role. In true workshop fashion, there will be time for discussion and doing a little personality testing.



W. Keith Campbell, Ph.D., Professor of Psychology at the University of Georgia, is the author of more than 200 scientific papers and several books, including a more recent publication, *The New Science of Narcissism*. His work on narcissism has appeared in *USA Today*, *Newsweek*, and *The New York Times*, and he has made numerous radio and television appearances, from the *Today Show* to the *Joe Rogan Experience*. He also wrote the popular TED-Ed lesson on narcissism. He holds a BA from the University of California at Berkeley, an MA from San Diego State University, and a Ph.D. from the University of North Carolina at Chapel Hill. He lives in Athens, Georgia, with his family.

Monica Sklar is an Assistant Professor at the University of Georgia as well as the Director/Coordinator of the university's Historic Clothing and Textiles Collection. She has a Ph.D. in Design-Apparel Studies from the University of Minnesota. Her main areas of study are 20th-century design history and social-cultural aspects of dress in conjunction with merchandising especially around subculture and music lifestyles. She also studies and activates museum best practices and advancements in archival work pertaining to clothing, particularly regarding diversity, digitization, and data usage for public and private collections.

Having friends over before kickoff play is one of the best ways to entertain on a Game Day. You can relax at home, stay cool in the air conditioning AND still have time to watch the game on TV. One of my favorite ways to serve brunch to a crowd is in a cast-iron skillet filled with sausage, biscuits, and eggs. It's filling for everyone and tastes as comforting as it looks. Adding a roasted vegetable like asparagus is an easy choice because it can be served totally made ahead and served at room temperature. And just like any other game-day menu, you must offer dessert. I love the little stacks of berries, phyllo dough, and whipped cream made tangy with buttermilk.
