



A Visual Guide to the MUI Process for Children at Summit DD

Summit DD, like each County Board in Ohio, is responsible for ensuring the health and safety of those we serve. Occasionally, there are circumstances that can pose a threat to the health, safety or welfare of child with a developmental disability; we refer to these incidents as Major Unusual Incidents (MUI).



MUI CASE OPENED

Allegation made meets MUI criteria

If information meets the criteria for Children Services case (or Intake), SCCS is the lead Agency investigating the case



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If information does not meet the criteria for SCCS, Summit DD becomes the lead Agency



INVESTIGATION

Lead Agency investigates the allegations

- Interviews
- Reviews documentation
- Causes and contributing factors
- Prevention plan development



FINDINGS & PREVENTION PLAN

The investigator will summarize the findings, including causes and contributing factors, into a summary report for your child's team. The team (which may include SCCS, Summit DD or other additional resources) will work together to create a voluntary prevention plan to help avoid future risk. An IA, SSA or RSS will then provide the summary of findings and prevention plan to the family.

GOAL

The health and safety of your child is our number one goal.



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
