

2026 VOTERS' RIGHTS

Get more information about curbside voting on Election Day by contacting the Summit County Board of Elections at 330-643-5200.

- You can bring any materials you need—including your phone, pamphlets, voter guides, or your own notes.
- You can bring someone to assist you as long as it's not your employer, a union representative, or someone on the ballot.
- You have the right to vote alone, if that's what you prefer.
- You have the right to get help from a poll worker. Note: Poll workers are only allowed to help you with the process of voting, such as understanding the machine, making something accessible, or clarifying instructions. They are not allowed to tell you who or what to vote for!
- You have the right to take as long as you need to vote.
- If you make a mistake on your ballot, you have the right to request a new ballot.

YOUR RIGHTS WHEN YOU VOTE

You have the right to vote curbside if you are physically unable to enter your polling location. With curbside voting, two poll workers from different political parties bring out a ballot, and you can vote while sitting in your vehicle.

- Look for designated curbside parking places at the Board of Elections.
- Call the Board using the phone number that is posted on a sign near the curbside voting parking places.
- On Election Day, you can send another person into the polling location to inform poll workers of your desire to vote curbside.
