A Festival of New Play Readings</u> features readings of new plays, written entirely by the members of TPC; many of whom have never written or directed a play previously. Do not expect elaborate set designs or visuals, but be prepared to watch as the words from these stories take life. **Be ready for the unexpected.**

Teatro Publico de Cleveland/Cleveland Public Theatre is unlike any other theatre, so allow yourself to venture where you never imagined, embrace your fear and turn it into a wonderful journey like I did 5 years ago when I started dreaming.


