Bentley, Glass on Deacon Jones Watch List

Senior running back Jordan Bentley and junior quarterback Aqeel Glass were named to the Deacon Jones Trophy watchlist during the preseason. The Deacon Jones Trophy is awarded by the Black College Football Hall of Fame to its player of the year. As a freshman in 2016, Bentley was the SWAC Freshman of the Year recipient. While splitting carries last season, the Guntersville, Ala. native rushed for 509 yards and seven touchdowns. Glass led the SWAC last season in passing with 2,421 yards and 20 touchdowns.

Five Bulldogs earn preseason all-conference honors

When the SWAC announced its preseason all-conference teams in July, Alabama A&M was well represented with five players earning all-conference honors. Junior linebacker Armoni Holloway and sophomore tight end Kendric Johnson were first-team selections, while sophomore receiver Brian Jenkins Jr., junior quarterback Aqeel Glass and senior offensive tackle Shonye Reams were second-team selections.

Seven Bulldogs earn spots on Phil Steele preseason team

Alabama A&M had seven players earn spots on the Phil Steele Preseason all-SWAC team. Junior linebacker Armoni Holloway and sophomore tight end Kendric Johnson were first-team selections, while senior running back Jordan Bentley, sophomore receiver Brian Jenkins Jr., senior offensive lineman Joshua Williams and senior offensive lineman Shonye Reams were second-team selections. Junior quarterback Aqeel Glass was a third-team selection. Senior cornerback Mike Mills, junior receiver Zabrian Moore and senior safety Desmond Fletcher were honorable mentions on the Phil Steele preseason all-SWAC team.

Eastman brings new scheme, experience to AAMU defense

There are a few new faces this season on the Alabama A&M sideline. One of the most notable is the person who oversees the Bulldogs' defense. During the offseason, coach Connell Maynor hired Granville Eastman as Alabama A&M's new defensive coordinator. Eastman comes to Alabama A&M from South Carolina State, where he was the technician behind one of the MEAC's top defensive units. Since arriving at Alabama A&M, the veteran defensive coordinator has installed a new 4-2-5 scheme, which the coaching staff believes is a strong fit for the personnel Alabama A&M returns on the defensive side of the football. Alabama A&M finished last season ranked 39th in the FCS in total defense.

Holloway trying to build on breakout season

The 2018 season was a breakout campaign for Armoni Holloway. Throughout the season, the linebacker from Pinson, Ala. was among the FCS leaders in tackles. As a sophomore last season, Holloway averaged 9.8 tackles per game, which was 19th in the FCS. Holloway led the SWAC with 108 tackles. He also accounted for seven tackles for loss, 2.5 sacks, a forced fumble, two fumble recoveries, five pass breakups and an interception.

Alabama A&M returns veteran defensive secondary

One of the strengths for the Alabama A&M defense heading into the season is several veteran starters in the secondary. The Bulldogs return two multi-year starters at cornerback in senior Mike Mills and junior Tuwile Wilson. The unit also returns a pair of talented starters in strong safety Adrian Portlock and free safety Desmond Fletcher. Last season, Alabama A&M was ranked 13th in the FCS in pass defense, holding opponents to 177.1 yards per game.

Holloway among nation's leaders in tackles

For the second-straight season, Armoni Holloway is on pace to be one of the FCS leaders in tackles. After seven games, Holloway is 22nd in the FCS, averaging 9.3 tackles per game. This season, Holloway has recorded 65 tackles, with 33 solo tackles. The junior linebacker from Pinson, Ala. is 51st in the FCS with nine tackles for loss.

Bulldogs hope to continue trend with strong pass rush

Last season, a significant factor in Alabama A&M's strong pass defense was the Bulldogs' ability to rush the passer. Alabama A&M was ranked 15th in the FCS in sacks with 32, which was 2.91 per game. Even though Alabama A&M graduated its top pass rusher in Yurik Bethune, the Bulldogs' coaching staff believe they have the personnel capable of applying steady pressure on opposing quarterbacks. Last week against North Alabama, Alabama A&M sacked quarterback Christian Lopez four times.

Alabama A&M offense has sights on explosive plays

A staple in Connell Maynor's debut season at Alabama A&M was the program's significant growth on offense. In one year, Alabama A&M went from 101 in the FCS in total offense to 55. Now, as Maynor heads into Year 2, the Alabama A&M offense expects to take another significant step. Alabama A&M returns nine offensive starters, including four preseason all-conference selections in quarterback Aqeel Glass, offensive tackle Shonye Reams, tight end Kendric Johnson and wide receiver Brian Jenkins Jr. Alabama A&M averaged 392.2 yards per game last season.

Bulldogs return experience on offensive line

An area where Alabama A&M is flush with experience is on the offensive line, where the Bulldogs return four starters in left tackle Shonye Reams, left guard Joshua Williams, center Trevoris Butler and right tackle Robert Samuel. Alabama A&M's new starter on the offensive line, right guard Dexter Fuqua, also played significant snaps last season.

Glass grows into leadership role at quarterback

Aqeel Glass is a major factor on the Alabama A&M offense. Last year, in his first full season as Alabama A&M's starting quarterback, Glass led the SWAC in passing with 2,426 yards and 20 touchdowns, earning second-team all-conference honors. But Glass' development on the field was not the only area where the junior from St. Louis made significant growth. Glass also grew into a leadership role, building strong off-the-field relationships with his peers on the Alabama A&M offense.

Big-play threats plentiful on Alabama A&M offense

Not only does Alabama A&M return nine starters on offense, but the Bulldogs also have several big-play threats at receiver. Sophomore receiver Brian Jenkins Jr. was eighth in the SWAC last season with 475 receiving yards and two touchdowns, averaging 43.2 yards per game and 9.9 yards per catch. The Bulldogs also return the team's third-leading receiver in Zabrian Moore. The 6-foot-3 junior from Tuscaloosa, Ala. was 18th in the SWAC with 375 and three touchdowns, averaging 13.8 yards per catch. Another big-play threat returning to the Alabama A&M offense is H-Back Kendrick Johnson. The 6-3 sophomore from New Market, Ala., who was a preseason first-team all-conference selection, averaged 8.9 yards per catch.

Bentley has sights on strong finish to AAMU career

During the past three seasons, Jordan Bentley has been a staple in the Alabama A&M offensive backfield. The 6-foot-1 and 217-pound senior running back from Guntersville, Ala. has been a steady leader for the Bulldogs throughout his career, both on and off the field. Bentley made an immediate splash at Alabama A&M in 2016, when he led the Bulldogs in rushing and was named the SWAC Freshman of the Year.

Bentley breaks one rushing record, closing in two more

Jordan Bentley set a new Alabama A&M record for career rushing touchdowns earlier this season against Central State. The senior from Guntersville, Ala. has 30 career rushing touchdowns. Now Bentley is chasing two more Alabama A&M records: Single-season rushing yards (1,123 by Ulysses Banks in 2009), and career rushing yards (2,559 by Banks from 2007-09). Bentley has rushed for 662 yards this season, and has 2,449 career rushing yards.

Season's first AAMU offensive, defensive series productive

To say Alabama A&M opened the season on a positive note is an understatement. The Bulldogs' first sequence of series were highly successful. Gary Quarles returned the opening kickoff against Morehouse 54 yards into opposing territory, and then on the season's first play, Aqeel Glass threw a 40-yard touchdown pass to Zabrian Moore. On the following series, the Alabama A&M defense got in on the fun, forcing a turnover on its first series of the season.

Bulldogs show composure in season debut

Alabama A&M proved it can withstand adversity in its season-opener against Morehouse in Canton, Ohio. After giving up a go-ahead touchdown with 1:01 remaining in the game, quarterback Aqeel Glass led the Bulldogs on a 61-yard drive, throwing the game-winning touchdown pass to Brian Jenkins Jr. with three seconds remaining.

Bulldogs enjoy football's history, tradition at Hall of Fame

The Black College Football Hall of Fame Classic in Canton, Ohio provided the members of Alabama A&M's football program to explore the sport's deep history and tradition. Not only did the Bulldogs get an opportunity to tour the Pro Football Hall of Fame, and its new Black College Football Hall of Fame, but the players also got an opportunity to meet a few hall of famers. Former Alabama A&M and Pittsburgh Steelers great John Stallworth, a 2002 Pro Football Hall of Fame inductee, recorded a pre-game message for the Alabama A&M players. Stallworth also asked two of his former Pittsburgh Steelers teammates, Pro Football Hall of Fame inductees Mel Blount and Donnie Shell, to visit the Alabama A&M players at the team's hotel in Canton.

Two new additions on Bulldogs' offensive staff

A few changes occurred during the offseason on the Alabama A&M coaching staff. Connell Maynor hired Fred T. Farrier as the team's new running backs coach and Bobby Turner as fullbacks coach. Maynor also moved Markus Lawrence to offensive line coach. Farrier brings lots of experience to the position. Before coming to Alabama A&M, Farrier was the receivers coach at South Carolina State. He also was the head coach at Morgan State for two seasons.

Sophomore Quarles leads SWAC in kick return yardage

Sophomore Gary Quarles has experienced some highs and lows in Alabama A&M's special teams this season. As a return specialist on kickoffs, Quarles helped set up Alabama A&M's game-winning drive in the final minute of the fourth quarter against Morehouse by returning a kick to near midfield. Through seven games, Quarles leads the SWAC in kick returns with 19 returns for 451 yards, but he also has lost three fumbles on special teams.

Tight ends emerging as weapons in AAMU offense

Heading into the season, Alabama A&M offensive coordinator Duane Taylor felt like the Bulldogs' tight ends could be valuable weapons for the offense. Through seven games, Kendrick Johnson and Anthony Howard have lived up to the hype, accounting for six of Alabama A&M's 20 passing touchdowns. Johnson, a 6-foot-3 and 235-pound sophomore from Hazel Green, Ala., has caught 17 passes for 231 yards and three touchdowns. He was a first-team selection on the SWAC's preseason all-conference team. Howard, a 6-3 and 240-pound junior from Birmingham has caught six passes for 42 yards and two touchdowns.

Bulldogs' offense among nation's leaders in multiple categories

The Alabama A&M offense has opened the season strong, scoring 30 or more points in four of five games. Those performances have the Bulldogs among the nation's leaders in multiple categories. Alabama A&M is ranked 19th in the FCS in total offense, averaging 450.4 yards per game. Alabama A&M is ranked 17th in passing offense, averaging 301 yards per game. The Bulldogs also are ranked 37th in the FCS in scoring at 32.7 points per game.

Glass ranked 10th in FCS in passing TDs, 11th in passing yards

Alabama A&M junior quarterback Aqeel Glass is off to a strong start to the season. Heading into Week 9 of the college football season, Glass is ranked 11th in the FCS in passing with 2,062 yards. The junior from St. Louis also is tied for 10th in the FCS with 19 passing touchdowns, and he is 13th in passing yards per game at 294.6. He also is 18th in passing efficiency at 150.8, completing 164 of 259 attempts with six interceptions.

Moore 21st in FCS in receiving yards; Ibrahim 16th in TDs

Glass strong start to the season has provided the Alabama A&M receiving corps to pile up lofty yard totals. Junior Zabrian Moore is 21st in the FCS in receiving with 631 yards and four touchdowns, averaging 90.1 yards per game and 17.5 yards per catch. Freshman Abdul-Fatai Ibrahim is 16th in the FCS with six receiving touchdowns. He also is fourth in the SWAC with 437 yards, averaging 72.8 yards per game and 18.2 yards per catch. Sophomore tight end Kendrick Johnson is 24th in the SWAC with 231 yards and three touchdowns on 17 receptions.

Bentley 16th in FCS in rushing TDs, 22nd in rushing yards

Jordan Bentley is putting together a strong encore season. Through seven games, Bentley is 16th in the FCS with nine rushing touchdowns, and he is 22nd in the FCS with 662 rushing yards.

Bentley, Holloway earn SWAC honors following UNA game

A pair of strong performances from Jordan Bentley and Armoni Holloway earned the AAMU duo SWAC Player of the Week honors following the Bulldogs' 31-24 win at North Alabama. Bentley rushed for 126 yards and two touchdowns on 26 carries, and he caught three passes for three passes for 37 yards and a score to earn SWAC Offensive Player of the Week. Holloway recorded 11 tackles, five tackles for loss, a sack and forced a fumble to earn SWAC Defensive Player of the Week.

Glass earns SWAC Player of Week following Texas Southern game

Alabama A&M quarterback eclipsed the 300-yard passing plateau for the fourth time in six games in the Bulldogs' 35-28 win against Texas Southern. Following the game, Glass was selected as the SWAC Offensive Player of the Week. Glass passed for 377 yards and four touchdowns in the game, completing 28 of 38 attempts, including a 12-yard go-ahead touchdown pass to Kendrick Johnson in overtime.

Corey shows there is more to his game than just kicking

Spencer Corey has made an impact as Alabama A&M's punter/place kicker. At Samford, however, the junior proved there is more to his game than just kicking when he took a fake punt and ran 72 yards down the sideline for a touchdown (AAMU's longest play of the season). Corey currently is Alabama A&M's third leading rusher with 75 yards.

CONNELL MAYNOR: HEAD COACH

Connell Maynor is in his second season at the helm of the Alabama A&M football program, and as this new chapter on “The Hill” already is off to an exciting start.

In his debut season at Alabama A&M, Maynor led the Bulldogs to a 6-5 record—the program’s first winning campaign in six years.

Alabama A&M is the third head coaching position in Maynor’s career. In nine seasons, Maynor has amassed a 74-39 overall record and coached in a national title game.

Maynor comes to Alabama A&M after spending the previous four seasons at Hampton, where he posted a 20-25 overall record and a 17-15 mark in the Mid-Eastern Athletic Conference. Last season, Maynor led Hampton to a 6-5 record, finishing 5-3 in the MEAC.

Before making the move to Hampton, Maynor built a Division II football power at Winston-Salem State.

In four seasons at Winston-Salem State, Maynor amassed an impressive 45-6 overall record, and his Rams were nearly perfect in the Central Intercollegiate Athletic Association with a 26-2 mark.

During his tenure at Winston-Salem State, Maynor consistently led the Rams deep into the Division II postseason, including an appearance in the 2012 national championship game.

In his final three seasons at Winston-Salem State, Maynor’s Rams were a perfect 21-0 in CIAA play.

In 2010, Maynor led Winston-Salem State to a 13-1 record and an appearance in the Division II playoff semifinals. That season, the Rams posted the best record by an HBCU program.

Maynor’s third season at Winston-Salem State was the best in 2012 by any HBCU. With All-American quarterback Kameron Smith, the Rams rolled to an 11-0 regular season record, winning the CIAA title and claiming a top seed in the Division II playoffs.

In the 2012 postseason, Winston-Salem State opened with consecutive wins against Shippensburg, Indiana-PA and West Texas A&M before falling to Valdosta State in the national title game.

Maynor is working to duplicate that type of success at Alabama A&M, relying on player development and an aggressive brand of football to establish the Bulldogs as a championship contender.





CONNELL MAYNOR: HEAD COACH



Maynor's football success is not limited to his time as a coach. He also enjoyed plenty of success as a player, winning six championships during his career.

Maynor started his college football career in 1987 as Winston-Salem State's starting quarterback under former coach William "Bill" Hayes. In his debut season as Winston-Salem State's signal caller, Maynor passed for 1,071 yards while helping guide the Rams to a CIAA title.

The following season, Hayes left Winston-Salem State to take the helm at North Carolina A&T, and Maynor followed his head coach and mentor. The move was a success. As North Carolina A&T's quarterback, Maynor led the Aggies to the 1991 MEAC championship.

In 1990 and 1991, Maynor was the MEAC Offensive Player of the Year.

Maynor was inducted into the North Carolina A&T Sports Hall of Fame with its 2014 class.

Maynor's playing accolades are not limited to college football. Maynor also enjoyed success as a professional quarterback in the Arena Football League, where he led the Tampa Bay Storm to the 1993 and 1994 Arena Bowl championships, and the Orlando Predators to the 1998 and 2000 Arena Bowl championships.

In 2000, Maynor was named the Arena Bowl's Most Valuable Player.

Before Maynor got his first head coaching job at Winston-Salem State, he was a highly-successful assistant coach at Fayetteville State, where he spent 10 seasons as quarterbacks coach and offensive coordinator. During that tenure, he helped Fayetteville State win CIAA championships in 2002, 2003 and 2009.

In addition to his coaching responsibilities at Fayetteville State, Maynor also worked as the offensive coordinator with the Arena Football League's Philadelphia Soul from 2006-2008, helping lead the Soul to the 2008 Arena Bowl championship.

Maynor and his wife, Meryl, have a daughter, Nicole.



GRANVILLE EASTMAN: DEFENSIVE COORDINATOR



Granville Eastman comes to Alabama A&M University Football Program with over 20 years of collegiate coaching experience to his credit.

Prior to landing on “The Hill” Eastman spent five years at North Carolina Central University, where he was instrumental as the architect of defenses that were atop the MEAC conference and FCS in many statistical categories. From 2014 to 2016 NCCU won a share of or were outright MEAC champions.

In 2016 NCCU had one of the top rated defenses in the MEAC that led them to play in the second “U.S. Air Force Reserve Celebration Bowl” versus Grambling State University. Ultimately becoming Black College National Champions “Runner Ups.”

At North Carolina Central University he served as assistant head coach, defensive coordinator and safeties coach until his promotion to interim head coach on Dec. 8, 2017.

Prior to joining NCCU, Eastman spent nine seasons (2005-13) as the defensive coordinator at Austin Peay State University in Clarkesville, Tennessee. During his 11 total seasons at APSU, he coached defensive backs and linebackers, and also served as special teams coordinator (2003-04) and interim head coach (winter 2013).

Eastman coached four seasons (1999-2002) at Tiffin University in Ohio, including the last three seasons as defensive coordinator and recruiting coordinator, while working with defensive backs and defensive line during his tenure.

A native of Toronto, Canada, Eastman secured his first coaching position at York University in his hometown, where he spent two seasons (1994-95) working with defensive backs.

He then served as a defensive graduate assistant for three seasons (1996-98) at Arkansas State University, earning a mas-

ter’s degree in sociology in 1999.

He has interned with five NFL teams since 2002, lending his services to the Detroit Lions (2002), Arizona Cardinals (2004), Tennessee Titans (2006), Indianapolis Colts (2011) and Minnesota Vikings (2012).

Eastman was a two-time all-city defensive back at Stephen Leacock High School in Toronto before attending Saint Mary’s University in Halifax, Nova Scotia, Canada, where he was a three-year letterman as a defensive back. Twice Saint Mary’s played in national title games while he was there. Eastman earned his bachelor’s degree from Saint Mary’s University in 1992.

Eastman also volunteers as a coach and mentor with the Fellowship of Christian Athletes.

He is married to Lynnette Armstrong. They are the proud parents of two sons - J.R. and Brandon.



DUANE TAYLOR: OFFENSIVE COORDINATOR



In eight years of coaching at the collegiate level, Taylor has established a reputation for developing talent.

After arriving at Alabama A&M last season, Taylor helped design one of the top offenses in the Southwestern Athletic Conference.

Taylor spent three seasons at Hampton, including the 2017 season when he was the Pirates' offensive coordinator. With Taylor calling the plays, Hampton averaged 321.5 yards and 21.5 points per game.

Before being elevated to offensive coordinator, Taylor spent two seasons as the Pirates' wide receivers and quarterbacks

coach. During that tenure, he coached wide receiver Twarn Mixson to a First-Team All-MEAC campaign.

Following his first two seasons at Hampton, Taylor left for Fayetteville State, where he was hired as offensive coordinator. In his debut season as Fayetteville State's offensive coordinator, the Broncos finished second in the CIAA's Southern Division, and running back Stevie Green was selected as CIAA Rookie of the Year after rushing for 1,150 yards.

Before going to Hampton, Taylor spent four seasons at Winston-Salem State, working as wide receivers coach under head coach Connell Maynor. During his

tenure at Winston-Salem State, the Rams emerged as a Division II power, winning two CIAA championships and advancing to the 2012 Division II national championship game.

Before moving to the college ranks, Taylor worked as a high school assistant football and basketball coach at Towers High School (Ga.) and Hoke County High School (N.C.).

Taylor played four seasons of college football at Fayetteville State. As a quarterback, he led the Broncos to two CIAA championships in 2002 and 2003. He is a native Roanoke, Va.



JASON MAI: QUARTERBACKS | FOOTBALL OPS

Since starting his coaching career 14 years ago, Jason Mai has established a reputation as one of the brightest young offensive minds in the game.

Mai spent the 2017 season at Hampton, working under Connell Maynor, and the previous season he was the quarterbacks coach and offensive coordinator at St. Augustine.

Before going to St. Augustine, Mai spent five seasons as the quarterbacks coach and passing game coordinator at Winston-Salem State, where he helped develop one of the top offensive units in Division II football.

While at Winston-Salem State, Mai was part of a program that amassed a 51-11 overall record and reached the 2012 Division II national championship game.

During his tenure at Winston-Salem State, Mai coached 18 all-CIAA

players and developed 2 All-American quarterbacks. He also was part of a team that led the CIAA in total offense five times, and was in the top 10 nationally three times.

Mai spent four seasons as the offensive line coach at Virginia Union from 2008-2011.

During that tenure, Mai helped develop an offense that averaged 24.6 points per game while averaging 312.2 yards and 158.3 rushing yards per game.

Before going to Virginia Union, Mai spent two seasons as quarterbacks coach at Johnson C. Smith University where he was a part of a team that logged the best single season turnaround in the NCAA and he mentored the schools all-time leading passer.

Mai started his career as wide receivers coach at his alma mater, Southwest Minnesota State.



FREDERICK FARRIER: RUNNING BACKS | RECRUITING



Frederick Farrier is entering his first season as a member of the Alabama A&M football coaching staff.

Farrier joins the Alabama A&M staff as the Bulldogs' running backs coach and recruiting coordinator.

Farrier comes to Alabama A&M after spending the 2018 season at South Carolina State, where he was associate head coach and wide receivers coach.

Before taking a position at South Carolina State, Farrier spent four seasons at Morgan State, including two (2016-17) as the Bears' head coach.

During Farrier's first season as Morgan State's head coach, the Bears had four student-athletes recognized to the all-MEAC team, and had 15 student-athletes named to the MEAC's All-Academic team.

Farrier originally joined the Bears in 2014 as the offensive coordinator and quarterbacks coach. He oversaw the development of quarterback

Moses Skillon, who was the MEAC's No. 5 leading passer in 2015.

Under Farrier's watch, Skillon completed 50.5 percent of his passes for 1,616 yards and 7 touchdowns and rushed for 420 yards and five scores in 2015. In 2014, Skillon passed for 1,392 and 11 touchdowns and led the Bears to its first MEAC championship in 35 years and its first ever FCS playoff appearance.

Farrier, a 16-year veteran of college football coaching ranks, joined the Bears after spending a pair of seasons as the passing game coordinator at RPI (Rensselaer Polytechnic Institute). Farrier served four seasons as the head coach of Kentucky State (2005-09), where he coached the Thoroughbreds to an average of over 30 points and 375 yards per game.

Prior to that, he was the associate head coach and offensive coordinator at Shaw University in 2004.



BOBBY TURNER: TIGHT ENDS | FULLBACKS

Bobby Turner is entering his first season as a member of the Alabama A&M football coaching staff.

Turner joins the Alabama A&M staff as the Bulldogs' tight ends and fullbacks coach.

Before coming to Alabama A&M, Turner spent the 2018 season at North Carolina Central as the tight ends coach. During the 2018 season, Turner coached Shermon McLeod, who led all MEAC tight ends in receiving yards and touchdowns while earning all-MEAC honors.

Turner served as a graduate assistant and video coordinator at NCCU from 2014-16 under head coach Jerry Mack. After earning his master's degree in athletic administration from

NCCU, he accepted another graduate assistant position at Bowling Green State University in 2017, working with the defensive line.

During the spring of 2018, Turner worked as linebackers and special teams coach at Shaw University in Raleigh, North Carolina.

Due to injury, Turner's playing career was cut short and he began student coaching with the offensive staff, as well as assisting with video operations.



MARKUS LAWRENCE: OFFENSIVE LINE



Lawrence joined the Alabama A&M coaching staff in 2018 after spending the previous season as the offensive line coach and running game coordinator at Bluefield College.

Before moving to Bluefield College, Lawrence spent three seasons as an assistant coach at Hampton, working under head coach Connell Maynor.

When Lawrence first arrived at Hampton in 2014, he served as the Pirates' offensive line coach. In 2016, he made the transition to tight ends coach.

As a player, Lawrence was a four-year starter on Winston-Salem State's

offensive line, where he played for Maynor. During his playing tenure, he was a two-time HBCU All-America selection, and in 2012, he won the Gene Upshaw Lineman of the Year award.

As a senior in 2012, he helped Winston-Salem State to a 14-1 record and an appearance in the Division II national championship game. That season, he was named a Daktronics All-American and an AP-Little All-American.

Lawrence is a native of Charlotte, N.C.



CHRIS SHELLING: SAFETIES | OUTSIDE LINEBACKERS

Chris Shelling comes to Alabama A&M with a strong resume as both a player and a coach.

Shelling came to “The Hill” last season from Holmes Community College in Goodman, Miss., where he spent four seasons as an assistant coach.

During Shelling’s final two seasons at Holmes, he served as the program’s defensive coordinator, where he established a reputation for sending players to Division I programs.

Before taking a position at Holmes, Shelling worked at Kossuth High School in Cornith, Miss, where he was the program’s defensive coordinator and Director of Strength and Conditioning.

Prior to his time at Kossuth, Shelling worked as a defensive assistant coach at Northeast Mississippi Community College for the 2008-2009 seasons. He was a graduate assistant

for the 2007 season at Troy, where the Trojans finished as the Sun Belt co-champions.

While at Troy, he graduated with a master’s degree.

Shelling graduated with a bachelor’s degree from Auburn, where he played four seasons for former coach Terry Bowden from 1991-1994. In 1994, he was named an All-American and was runner-up for the Jim Thorpe Award.

After graduating from Auburn, Shelling played with the Cincinnati Bengals and the Atlanta Falcons from 1995-1997, and he then played two seasons with the Rhein Fire in Europe.

Shelling originally is from Columbus, Ga.. His wife, Karen, is from Canada, and they have two sons, Elijah and Jonah.



KENYATTA McCOY: CORNERBACKS



Kenyatta McCoy is entering his first season as a member of the Alabama A&M football coaching staff.

McCoy joins the Alabama A&M staff as cornerbacks coach.

Before coming to Alabama A&M, McCoy spent the previous five seasons at North Carolina Central, where he coached cornerbacks and also served as the program’s recruiting coordinator.

During his tenure at North Carolina Central, McCoy coached a secondary that held opponents to 189.54 passing yards per game with 79 pass breakups and 11 interceptions.

While at North Carolina Central, McCoy helped develop a defense that was exceptionally good during clutch situations. During his tenure,

North Carolina Central was ranked sixth nationally in red zone defense, and seventh nationally in third-down defense.

In each season with McCoy on the coaching staff, North Carolina Central’s defense saw improvement.

By 2016, North Carolina Central become the nation’s 16th-best pass defense, and by 2018, the program’s third-down defense climb to a No. 2 national ranking.

While at North Carolina Central, McCoy coached a two-time all-MEAC cornerback in Mike Jones, and a two-time all-American cornerback in Ryan Smith, who also was selected in the fourth round of the 2016 NFL Draft.



CHARLES HUFF: DEFENSIVE LINE | SPECIAL TEAMS

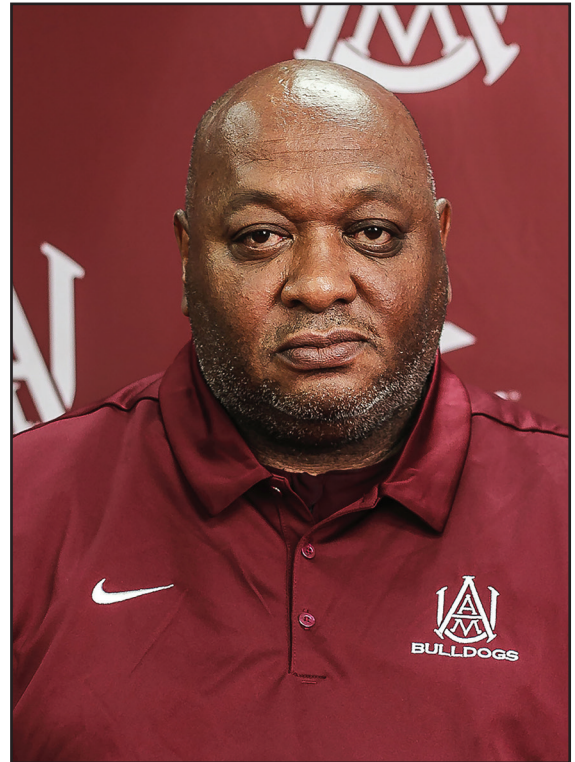
The veteran college coach of 28 years brings a variety of experience and vast football knowledge to the Alabama A&M coaching staff.

After spending eight seasons as Alabama A&M's kicking coach from 2007-2014, Wilson returned to Lee High School as an assistant football and tennis coach for three seasons.

Wilson returned to the Alabama A&M football staff during the offseason, after Connell Maynor was hired as the Bulldogs' new football coach.
