TIPOFF

- Alabama A&M and Auburn will be meeting for just the fourth time as the Tigers hold a 3-0 all-time series lead, which dates back to the 2007 season
- The Bulldogs will be meeting Auburn for the first time since the 2009 season
- Alabama A&M enters the game seeking its first victory of the season after falling on the road to North Alabama and Lipscomb
- The Bulldogs are in the midst of a five-game season-open road swing, with two more games this week at the Viking Invitational, hosted by Cleveland State
- In the two losses, Dailin Smith has carried the Alabama A&M offense, scoring 15 and 17 points, respectively in the two losses
- This is the first of three matchups against SEC opponents as Alabama A&M visit Vanderbilt on Dec. 2 and Georgia on Dec. 30
- The Bulldogs will look to reverse the trend of shooting under 40 percent from the floor and 30 percent from beyond the arc
- Auburn comes into the game riding a three-game winning streak after its season-opening 88-82 loss to No. 20 Baylor
- Since that loss, the Tigers have reeled off victories over Southeastern Louisiana, Notre Dame and St. Bonaventure
- Auburn has just two opponents from the SWAC on its schedule and both from the State of Alabama - Alabama A&M and Alabama State
- Johni Broome and Aden Holloway pace the Tigers offense, averaging 16.8 and 13.3 points, respectively
- Johni Broome is also the leading rebounder, averaging 8.3 boards, including 5.3 on the defensive glass

MEDIA CREDENTIALS

Media credentials for Alabama A&M must be requested through AAMU's official website. To begin the process, visit www.aamusports.com and under inside athletes, search Media Information. Only media covering the Bulldogs on a consistent basis and on assignment will be considered for season credentials. A lost season credential will result in credentials being issued on a game-by-game basis as available.

Traditional media (newspapers, radio and television) are credible and consider standard media and will be approved. Those covering the Bulldogs through various other

outlets (podcasts, facebook, instagram and youtube) are not acceptable forms of media and their credential requests will be denied.

PLAYER INTERVIEW AVAILABILITY

All interviews with Alabama A&M University student-athletes should be coordinated through the Athletic Communications Office. During the season, AAMU players are available after practices. No interviews will be conducted during practice. Telephone and/or Zoom interviews may be arranged by contacting Brian Howard in the Athletic Communications Office. ALL interview requests should be made at least 48 hours in advance. AAMU's first-year players (true freshmen) are not available for interviews.

COACH INTERVIEW AVAILABILITY

Interviews with Bulldog head coaches Margaret Richards and Otis Hughley Jr. should also be arranged through the Athletic Communications Office. Head coaches Margaret Richards and Otis Hughley Jr. are available for interviews throughout the week, after practices and after the conclusion of games. Telephone interviews with the head coach can be arranged by contacting the Athletic Communications Office. As with the student-athletes, interview requests should be made at least 48 hours in advance.

WEEKLY PRESS CONFERENCE

Alabama A&M head women's basketball coach Margaret Richards and head men's basketball coach Otis Hughley Jr. will meet with the media on Wednesdays at 1 p.m. inside the AAMU Event Center.

WEDNESDAY MEDIA PRESS CONFERENCES

Each game week during the basketball season, Alabama A&M will hold a media press conference at 1 p.m. in the AAMU Event Center. Alabama A&M head women's basketball coach Margaret Richards and head men's basketball coach Otis Hughley Jr. will speak at 1 p.m.

Players will only be available upon request at least 48 hours prior to the Wednesday's press conference. Contact the Athletic Communications Office for more details. AAMU will hold and conduct interviews during the open weeks of the season.

PRACTICE AVAILABILITY

Alabama A&M's basketball practices are closed to the public and media. The first portion of the workouts (generally the first 30-45 minutes) is open to photographers and videographers.

Members of the media planning to shoot practice should contact the AAMU Athletic Communications Office

in advance to confirm arrangements and practice times.

The Bulldogs practice inside the AAMU Event Center on the main arena floor.



A veteran developer of talent at the high school, college, professional, international and Olympic level, Otis Hughley, Jr. was named the 10th head men's basketball coach at Alabama A&M on April 18, 2022, bringing with him a wealth of coaching experience and expertise.

AT ALABAMA A&M

In his first season, he guided the Bulldogs to a 15-18 overall record and 10-8 in Southwestern Athletic Conference (SWAC) play. In the conference tournament, defeated Southern, 77-63, before falling to the eventual tournament champions, Texas Southern, 74-61.

PROFESSIONAL COACHING EXPERIENCE (NBA, 2010-16)

A well-known figure in the professional ranks, Hughley made the jump to the NBA in 2010-11 when he was hired as an assistant coach by the Sacramento Kings before joining the Golden State Warriors skill development and video departments in 2011-12. Following that season he would return to the Kings as a scout through 2016.

INTERNATIONAL COACHING EXPERIENCE (NIGERIA, SPAIN, CHINA)

A versatile coach, Hughley has had tremendous success on the international stage with both men and women, having served more than a decade with the National Basketball Association's (NBA) China Program.

HEAD COACH - OTIS HUGHLEY JR.

As part of that initiative he was the associate head coach for the Shandong Bulls Goldstone in 2002-03 and helped lead that franchise to a 31-11 record and a first round playoff appearance that season.

He would return to the international game 12 years later as a consultant to the Xinjiang Flying Tigers and as the head coach of the Chinese Taipei Men's and Women's National Teams in 2015-16. That same season he would serve as an assistant coach for the Tianjin Gold Lions in the Chinese Basketball Association (CBA).

In 2017 his international experience would continue to grow to include the women's game as he was named the head coach of the Nigerian Women's National Team. In that role he helped lead the program to three Afro-Basket Championships (2017, 2019, 2021), a No. 1 world ranking in Africa, No. 14 in the world and a berth in the 2022 World Cup. The latter made them one of the top 12 teams in the world.

Part of what helped them earn those august rankings was an impressive performance in the 2018 World Cup in Spain when they became the first African team to win a game outside of the continent when they won three in a row to reach the quarterfinals.

They defeated No. 7 Turkey, No. 16 Argentina and No. 20 Greece in that tournament and earned a berth in the 2020 Tokyo Olympics where they finished 11th. They are currently one of 12 teams that have qualified for the 2022 World Cup in Sydney, Australia.

HIGH SCHOOL COACHING CAREER (2004-10, LeFlore HS)

Prior to the professional and international opportunities, Hughley proved himself at the high school ranks in Alabama, posting a sterling 185-20 overall record from 2004-10.

In that time he guided the Rattlers to six Alabama State Final Four berths and a 6A State Championship in 2007. Following that title, he played a key role in developing 12-year NBA veteran DeMarcus Cousins from 2007-09, posting a 59-6 mark in those two years.

After being on the NBA radar while at LeFlore, Hughley would follow Cousins to the Association after he was drafted in the first round by the Sacramento Kings.

COLLEGE COACHING EXPERIENCE

While the majority of his coaching career has been spent at the professional and international level, Hughley has seven years of experience at the collegiate level.

WALLACE C.C.-SELMA (MEN'S AND WOMEN'S HEAD COACH, 1993-97)

He would begin that stretch with four years as the head men's and women's coach at Wallace Community College — Selma, posting a 135-46 record from 1993-97. Over the course of those four seasons he guided the men to a 90-25 record, two conference championships and a region runner-up finish and the women to a 45-21 mark that included a No. 4 national ranking.



WRIGHT STATE (ASSISTANT COACH, 1997-98)

Hughley would then make the jump to the NCAA ranks with Wright State in 1997-98 where he would play a key role in recruiting. In that time he signed Kevin Melson, the No. 2 scorer in the junior college ranks and a player that would go on to earn league Newcomer of the Year and First-Team All-Conference honors.

LIBERTY (ASSISTANT COACH, 1998-99)

After one season he joined Liberty as the top assistant in 1998-99 and was responsible for signing a Top-25 recruiting class. That group included Antonio Burks who would go on to play for the Memphis Grizzlies.

SOUTHERN (ASSOCIATE HEAD COACH, 2001-02)

His most recent collegiate men's basketball coaching stop came at Southern in 2001-02 where he served as an associate head coach to the legendary Ben Jobe, a 500-game winner at the college level. There he served as recruiting coordinator in addition to aiding with practice planning, skill development and game and scouting prep.

AUBURN (WOMEN'S BASKETBALL CONSULTANT, 2018-19)

In terms of college hardwood, his most recent stop came in the women's game as a member of Southeastern Conference (SEC) member Auburn's staff in 2018-19. There he served as a consultant to head coach Terri Williams-Flournoy, whose team produced the best record of her nine-year tenure with the Tigers, 22-10, that season.

CAMP COACHING EXPERIENCE

You don't get to be as well connected in the sport of basketball without making the rounds in the camp circuit and Hughley has certainly done that.

Chief among those was his association with the Pete Newell Big Man Camp for more than a decade, which is widely recognized as one of the most influential camps during its existence from 1976-2011.

He also served as a coach and teacher at long-time NBA player Kike Vandeweghe's Next Level NBA Camp and served as a director at the Nike All-Asia, All-Taiwan and All-Philippines Camps. Hughley has also been a skills coordinator at the Pro Hoops Combine which serves as a Women's National Basketball Association (WNBA) pre-draft camp.

EDUCATION

Hughley attended the College of Eastern Utah from 1982-83 before earning his Bachelor of Science in Business Administration (Computer Information Systems emphasis) in 1987 from Livingston College, now known as the University of West Alabama.

PERSONAL

A native of Atlanta, Georgia, Hughley and his wife Valerie are the parents of four children — Jeremiah, Trinitee, Heavyn and Joshua.

HISTORY AT A GLANCE

In 1920, athletic officials from six Texas HBCUs — C.H. Fuller of Bishop College, Red Randolph and C.H. Patterson of Paul Quinn College, E.G. Evans, H.J. Evans and H.J. Starns of Prairie View A&M, D.C. Fuller of Texas College and G. Whitte Jordan of Wiley College — met in Houston, Texas, to discuss common interests. At this meeting, they agreed to form a new league, the SWAC.

Paul Quinn became the first of the original members to withdraw from the league when it did so in 1929. When Langston University of Oklahoma was admitted into the conference two years later, it began the migration of state-supported institutions into the SWAC. Southern University entered the ranks in 1934, followed by Arkansas AM&N (now the University of Arkansas at Pine Bluff) in 1936 and Texas Southern University in 1954.

Rapid growth in enrollment of the state-supported schools made it difficult for the church-supported schools to finance their athletics programs and one by one they fell victim to the growing prowess of the state-supported colleges. Bishop withdrew from the conference in 1956, Langston in 1957 and Huston-Tillotson (formerly Samuel Huston) in 1959, one year after the admittance of two more state-supported schools: Grambling College and Jackson State College.

The enter-exit cycle continued in 1961 when Texas College withdrew, followed by the admittance of Alcorn A&M (now Alcorn State University) in 1962. Wiley left in 1968, the same year Mississippi Valley State College entered. Arkansas AM&N exited in 1970 and Alabama State University entered in 1982.

Arkansas-Pine Bluff (formerly Arkansas AM&N) rejoined the SWAC on July 1, 1997, regaining full-member status one year later. Alabama A&M University became the conference's tenth member when it became a full member in September, 1999 after a one year period as an affiliate SWAC member. Most of the former SWAC members that have left the conference are currently a part of the Red River Athletic Conference of the NAIA.

Current championship competition offered by the SWAC includes competition for men in baseball, basketball, cross country, football, golf, indoor track, outdoor track & field and tennis. Women's competition is offered in the sports of basketball, bowling, cross country, golf, indoor track, outdoor track & field, soccer, softball, tennis and volleyball.

THE MISSION AND PURPOSE OF THE SWAC

The Southwestern Athletic Conference, Inc. (the "SWAC", the "Conference") is organized exclusively for the purpose of encouraging, promoting, advancing, and conducting intercollegiate sports activities and other recreational and not-for-profit activities among the members of the Conference. Its purposes are:

- To uphold the principles of institutional control of, and responsibility for all collegiate sports conducted by the members of this organization in conformity with the Constitution and Bylaws hereof;
- To stimulate and improve intercollegiate athletic sports;
- To comply with satisfactory standards of scholarship and amateur standing and good sportsmanship;
- To preserve and maintain the collegiate athletic records of the members of the Southwestern Athletic Conference, and make them available upon request;
- To cooperate with other amateur athletic organizations in the promotion and conduct of intercollegiate athletic contests;
- To maintain fiscal management; and
- To legislate through Bylaws or Resolutions on subjects of general concern to the membership.

The members of the conference are committed to the philosophy of maintaining intercollegiate athletics as an integral part of the overall educational program. To this end, the conference believes in and subscribes to the fundamental principles of amateurism, institutional control, sound academic standards, financial aid, recruiting, and ethical conduct that governs intercollegiate athletics, and the enforcement of rules and regulations as adopted by the National Collegiate Athletic Association.
